
Registration will be held at the first class meeting. A fee of \$10 will be charged, although anyone over 65 may enroll free. For additional information, call 484-4015.

driver of the truck, Thomas Mack Cable, 32, of Route 1, Gastonia, was taken to Cleveland Memorial Hospital in Shelby and later transferred to Presbyterian Hospital in Charlotte.

Trooper Dale Keenum said the vehicle left the road on a sharp curve, turned on its side and struck the three. The wreck occurred around 3:54 a.m.

Assistant Cleveland County Coroner Dwight Tessneer said Wallace died of massive head injuries.

Volunteers from Grover Rescue Squad and Bethlehem Fire Department worked for more than an hour to free Cable from the cab of the truck.

Cable has been charged with driving while impaired and felony death by vehicle.
