Ingram Awarded **Scholarship**


Kings Mountain's Lisa Ingram has been awarded a basketball scholarship at North Greenville College in Tigerville, S.C.

Lisa will report to school on August 25 and will open practice with the team on October 1.

Ingram was a three-year performer at KMHS and helped lead the Mountainettes to their first ever Southwestern 3-A Conference title her junior year. Last year, she averaged eight points and 6.5 assists per game in leading the KM ladies to a 12-8 record and fourth place in the SWC, and served as team captain.

Ingram won the Moutainettes' free throw shooting award for compiling the best free throw percentage (73) during all practice sessions and games. She also was a U.S. National Award winner in basketball through the U.S. National Achievement program.

In addition to standing out on the basketball court, Ingram was also the only female on the KMHS cross country team, which won all but one of its regular season meets and finished second to R-S Central in the SWC. She qualified for the Sectional Cross country meet in Morganton.
