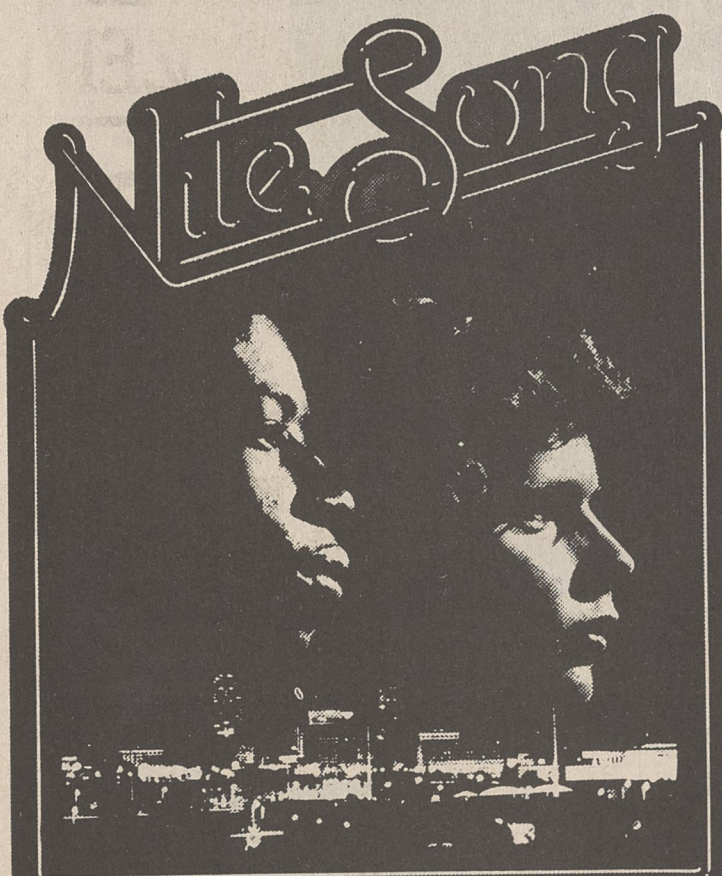
Film To Be Shown At Dixon Presbyterian
