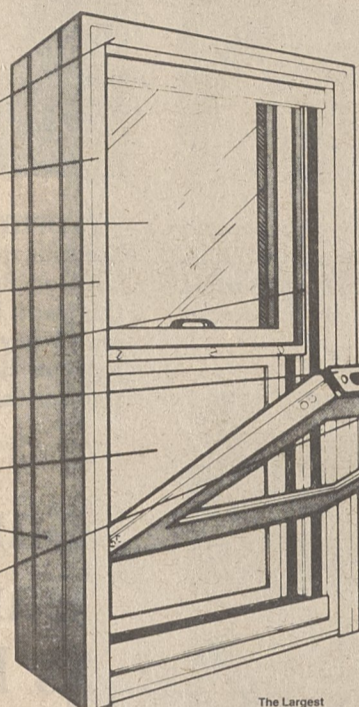

Chase Takes Advantage Of KM Mistakes, 19-8

Chase turned three first half Kings Mountain mistakes into touchdowns Friday night and defeated the Mountaineers 19-8 in a Southwestern 3-A Conference game played on the Trojans' home field.

The loss left the Mountaineers at 1-6 in the SWC and 1-7 overall. They host R-S Central Friday in their final home game and then close out their season next week at Shelby.

For the third week in a row, the Kings Mountain eleven won the statistical battle over their opponent but still came out on the short end of the score. Kings Mountain had 236 yards of total offense to 138 for the Trojans but a costly fumble and 110 yards in penalties did the Mountaineers in.

Both football teams looked like entirely different ballclubs than they did a week earlier. The Mountaineers were obviously back to their usual pattern of play after coming within a touchdown of upsetting South Point (34-26) and the Trojans were vastly improved over a 50-0 shelling at the hands of Shelby a week earlier.

Kings Mountain drove deep

into Trojan territory on numerous occasions but each time a mistake kept them from putting points on the board. The Mountaineers didn't score until the final play of the game when Timmy Elder took a short pass from Roderick Boyce in the flat and turned it into a nine-yard touchdown pass. Boyce ran for a two-point conversion with no time showing on the clock.

The Mountaineers appeared ready to record their second win of the season when they marched the opening kickoff to the Chase 15 yard line. But a 37-yard field goal attempt by Don Quandoudone hit the crossbar and fell short.

The Trojans gained the momentum several minutes later when they blocked a Keefer Ballew punt and recovered it at the Kings Mountain one yard line. Quarterback Brian Foster scored for the Trojans for a 7-0 lead.

On the ensuing kickoff, the Mountaineers fumbled and the Trojans recovered at the 24 yard line. On the first play of the second period, Foster hit Howard Parry on a 15-yard touchdown pass to make it 13-0.

Late in the first half, the Trojans mounted an 85-yard touchdown drive with Foster passing 31 yards to Rodney Moseley with 48 seconds left to make it 19-0. The Mountaineers had the Trojans backed up to the 12 on the first series of the drive but roughed Foster on a third and long and gave the Trojans a first down.

The Mountaineers had three drives stopped inside the Chase 20 yard line, one on the missed field goal attempt and two others on losses of downs. One touchdown run by Boyce was nullified by a penalty and an apparent touchdown pass from Boyce to Otis Brooks was ruled to have been caught out of bounds.

The victory increased the Trojans' record to 3-4 in the SWC and 3-5 overall. They are tied for fourth place with R-S Central, Burns and East Gaston. The Mountaineers are alone in the SWC cellar.

Eric Odems led the KM rushing with 72 yards in 18 carries. Boyce hit on 8 of 26 passes for 93 yards and the only KM touchdown. He also threw two interceptions.

Dilling Bows 424 Set

John Dilling turned in his second 400-plus set of the season Tuesday night at Dilling Heating Lanes to lead his team to three victories over Johnny Dye.

Dilling rolled single games of 118, 150 and 156 for a 424 series. Johnny Dye led the losers with a 147 line and 374 set.

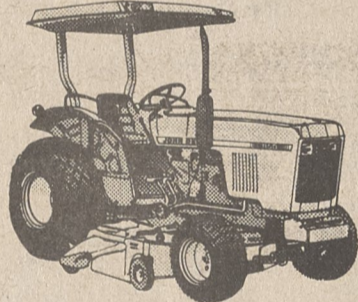
Busters Win Four From Them
