

### **AVERAGE OR MEDIAN?** By Ruby M. Alexander

The average price of a new house is \$100,000


Those are the statistics -- they are misleading. First, an "average" price can be skewed by extreme figures. For instance, if you average the sales of eight \$50,000 houses and one \$500,000 property, the "average" sale price is \$100,000. But that certainly doesn't reflect the sales accurately.

A median figure gives a much better picture. To arrive at a median, one puts all sales figures in a line and discards those at either end. The number in the middle--the middle of the whole price range paid for property--is the median. The median price is considerably lower than the average today, about \$80,000.

Statistics usually refer to the price of a new home, but most transactions are resales, and the market price of these is usually lower still.

Do statistics matter? They give an overall view of the housing market, but what really matters is what YOUR house is worth when you sell it.
