Annexation Studied

Board, (all of whom were present), on the annexation plan. He said the first step has involved "long work by the city, planning and zoning boards and with this inauguration tonight of this program feel we can get to full bloom..we don't have time to lose. Some may feel these boundaries enormous but all will appreciate what can be accomplished for the quality of life for everyone in the Kings Mountain area." he said.

Houston pointed out that the area under consideration parallels Interstate 85 and the long range program will cover a four year period. "During this first year a lot of leg work will need to be done," he said.

Most of the targeted area is in Cleveland County but specific boundaries won't be decided for


some time.

"We're saying this is the area we are now considering", Houston reiterated. We can't say how much of the area we will actually annex."

Mayor John Moss called attention to the fact that Kings Mountain, with excess water and sewage treatment capacity, and with Moss Lake, could serve industrial and residential growth brought about by annexation. He said the city can expand only with the capabilities of water and sewer and city services for more citizens, and noted that annexation is being considered by the city commission because of the growing costs of providing municipal services and to acquire a strong tax base. "I know people hear me say all the time that want to improve the quality of life for all citizens, but that is exactly what the annexation program and the new utility district will do for us", he said in a statement prior to the board's action. After the meeting, Gene White, who also serves on the annexation committee from the local office of community development, said the timetable will follow this schedule for completion:

Resolution of Consideration, 365 days; Resolution of Intent, 45 to 90 days; Public Hearings;, 10 to 90 days; Passage of Annexation Ordinance, 40 to 400 days; and effective date of ordinance, 460 to 945 days or covering a four year period.

The board, White said, could take no further legal action for at least a year, under state law. During this time period the board will be in process of evaluation of all services needed, such as utilities, cost revenue projections, etc. and commissioners will be working with a planning agency to put together a complete annexation report. At the end of the first year, the city can pass a resolution of intent and that identifies the specific area to be annexed and only after evaluation of long range goals. After the resolution of intent is passed by the board, legal steps could be initiated to complete the annexation and public hearings would then be scheduled to receive citizen input. Also, during that process, every citizen would be notified in a thorough process undertaken to involve all citizens living in a propsed annexed area. When an annexation ordinance
