MILDRED COX

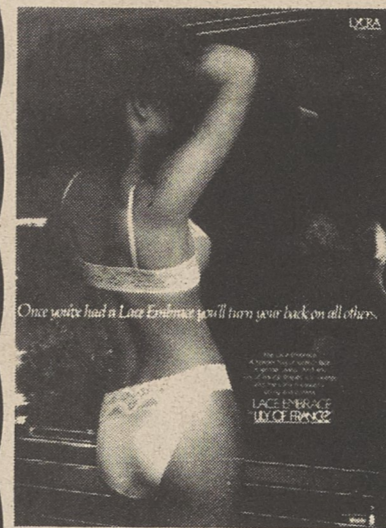
Mildred Cobb Cox, 76, of 204 South Tracy Street, Kings Mountain, died Monday at Kings Mountain Hospital.

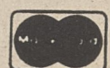
