Taste Makes Waist, And Heartburn

The holiday season is well under way and your diet is probably only a memory. You know taste makes waist. But did you know that more taste may also cause heartburn?

Actually heartburn, a burning sensation behind the breastbone, has nothing to do with the heart. It occurs when stomach acid

moves up into the esophagus, irritating its lining.

"Heartburn can be caused when people eat too much foods that contain fat, chocolate or peppermint," Dr. Donald Castell, professor of medicine (gastroenterology) at the Bowman Gray School of Medicine, said. "Drinking too much alcohol also can cause heartburn."

Once the lining of the esophagus becomes irritated, other foods and drinks can aggrevate the irritation. These include citrus juices, coffee and foods having tomatoe in them.

Castell has two suggestions on

should try not to eat and drink too heavily during the holidays," he said. "We should also avoid lying down within the first hour or two after eating. When a person lies down on a full stomach,

it is much easier for the stomach acid to move into the

There are a variety of antacid medications available without a prescription that help to relieve the symptoms. If they don't work, Castell suggests seeing a physician for a more effective medication or to make sure that nothing more serious is causing them to feel bad.
