packed into a 1-3-1 zone defense. East began forcing the action with 34 seconds remaining and Sherer got loose under the basket for a layup with 25 seconds left to put KM ahead 65-63. Ken Byrd of the Cavaliers hit a long jumper with four seconds remaining to tie the game and force a second three-minute over-

East Rutherford's Smith missed a layup at the 2:40 mark of the second OT and the Moun-taineers again elected to hold the ball outside rather than shoot over the East zone. With 20 seconds left, Curry was fouled but missed the front end of the one-and-one. Crocker missed a tip-in attempt but Sherer rebounded the shot and put it in with 14 seconds left to give KM a 67-65 lead.

Byrd again connected from downtown with three seconds left to tie it at 67-all and force the third extra period.

The Cavaliers controlled the tip and elected to play run-and-gun and that suited the Mountaineers. Sherer scored at the 2:37 mark to make it 69-67, then Curry stole the ball and went in for a layup to give the Mounties a 71-67 lead. East cut it to 71-69, but then Curry hit a pair of free throws at the 1:44 mark to make it 73-69, and Sherer scored off an assist from Curry with 1:05 to play to make it 75-69. The closest the Cavaliers could get after that was five points when Byrd hit a pair of free throws with 50 seconds left to make it 76-71.

Curry finished with 29 points to lead the Mountaineers. Crocker added 18 points and 18 rebounds and Jordan had 10 points. Smith scored 25 and Byrd 18 for the Cavaliers, who fell to 8-7 and into a tie with Burns for fourth

"I have to give East a lot of credit," said a drained KMHS Coach Larry Sipe after the game. "They're going to be a factor in the tournaments.

Sullens Sectional Champion

Kings Mountain's Vince Sullens won the 132-pound weight division in the Southwestern Sectional Wrestling Tournament Saturday at West Mecklenburg High School in Charlotte.

Sullens and Farris Turner, who finished second in the 112-pound division, will represent the Mountaineers in the Western Regionals Saturday at A.L. Brown High School in Kannapolis. If they finish in the top four there, they will advance to the State Tournament February 22-23 at Winston-Salem Parkland.

Sullens, who has lost only two matches this year, defeated Darryl Brown of East Mecklenburg in the championship match. Also qualifying at 132 was Rodney Friday of East Gaston, who finished fourth.

Turner lost his championship bout to Darryl Seagars of West Mecklenburg. Shelby's Barry Hopper finished third.

As a team, the Mountaineers, who won last week's Southwestern 3-A Conference tournament, finished 10th. West Mecklenburg won the team title with 130 points and Independence was second at Crest was third and Shelby fourth.

Other SWC wrestlers qualifying for the regionals were Chuck McGinnis of Chase at 98 pounds, Scott Holden of East Gaston and Tyrone Mc-Cluney of Crest at 105, Dwayne Brooks of Shelby at 119, Charles Thomas of Crest at 145, Phil Crowder of Shelby and Donald Moore of Crest at 167, Lee Gragg of Crest and Paul Lockett of Burns at 185, Glenn Thompson of Shelby at 195 and Jami Jones of Chase at unlimited.

Kevin Madden should help UNC from the start next year. The 6-6 high school senior's averaging 25.8 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists. A few days ago, he blocked 8 shots-including 4 by a 6-11 center. Some are comparing him to Michael Jordan... My vote for the Sullivan Award went to Mary Lou Retton, but Bill Johnson might be more deserving. No American had ever finished higher than fifth in Olympic Alpine skiing until Johnson won the gold at Saraievo. But Mary Lou'll be named America's top amateur athlete—as much for her smile as for her talents.

Duke's the nation's best team—mathematically speaking, that is. An M.I.T. graduate in math ranks the Blue Devils first based on a combination of schedule strength and scores against Division I teams. Maryland's 16, UNC 17, Tech 23, State 33, Wake 38, Clemson 54 and Virginia 68...Just wondering: Wouldn't Duke stack up against Georgetown or anybody else if they had a Mike Gminski at center this year?

A player with 18 rebounds in a game is big news today, but Wake's Dickie Hemric averaged 18.5 over a 4-year career...I sat next to Catfish Hunter at the Charlotte Hall of fame banquet last week. The Cat looks as if he could still go nine... Gaylord Perry has a 6-8 son who's quite a basketball player. If he's the competitor his dad was, he'll go places...I look for Manager Pete Rose to build a fire under the Cincinnati Reds this year-both from the bench and on

How good is Michael Jordan? Well-when Larry Bird says he's the best he has ever seen, (better than Dr. J, better than Jabbar, better than Magic Johnson) that's enuf said right there...! like Al McGuire. I like him a lot. But when the "Coach" says he'd put 5-3 Tyrone Bogues on his All-American team, I gotta wonder. Bogues is spectacular, but aren't there five better college players than this tiny marvel?...The ACC's as balanced as it has ever been, but my choice in the ACC Tourney is UNC-again.
