## Mrs. Marvin On Committee

RALEIGH -- Senator Helen Rhyne Marvin (D-Gaston) has been appointed by President pro-tem of the Senate J.J. Harrington to a two year term with the National Conference on State Legislatures Committee on Arts, Tourism, and Cultural Resources. Marvin has served two prior terms on this board.

The National Conference of State Legislatures is one of the most prestigious policy influencing bodies in the nation, representing the views of legislatures from all over the United States in presentations before Congress.

With the Committee on Arts, Tourism and Cultural Resources, Marvin will study the economic impact of the arts, historic preservation, cultural activities, and tourism. She will also work in design issues in urban revitalization through the arts and historic preservation.

The Committee will be engaged in proposing model legislation for state arts promotion and will analyze issues in arts legislation.

Tourism is one of North Carolina's leading growth industries, and legislation affecting the tourism industry, as well as downtown revitalization and arts programs have lasting economic impact on the state.

"I have found the work on this committee interesting and beneficial to North Carolina," Marvin said. "Among other things, the NCSL works as an information exchange and helps us keep informed about what is an information exchange and helps us keep informed about what is happening in other states in these areas."

Lieutenant Governor Bob Jordan has also appointed Marvin as the Senate representative to the Council on Educational Services for Exceptional Children.

"This is one of my main areas of interest," Marvin said.

"There is so much work that needs to be done in the area of children's services. I am particularly honored by this appointment because the lieutenant governor is placing such a high priority on children's issues."

Dr. F.J. Sincox of Kings Mountain has been re-elected to the North Carolina Academy of Family Physicians.

In order to become eligible for this honor, our members are required to complete 150 hours of continuing medical education (CME) during the past three years. He joins 262 of the state's nearly 1,000 practicing family physicians

in achieving this educational goal this year.

The primary thrust of the North Carolina Academy of Family Physicians, a constituent chapter of the American Academy of Family Physicians, is continuing medical education. In addition to the 150 hours required for re-election to the NCAFP, members must accumulate 300 hours of continuing

medical education for Board certification. Family medicine is the only medical specialty to require Board certification every 7 years.

Family medicine became a medical specialty February 8, 1969 with the inception of its residency training program. During the initial period of the specialty, (then) general practitioners were allowed to take a certification examination and become

family physicians. Now, however, all must complete a three-year family practice medicine residency training program to be eligible for certification by the American Board of Family Practice.

Family medicine is the nation's largest medical specialty, comprising over 58,000 family physicians. (A service of the North Carolina Academy of Family Physicians.)
