Briggs submitted a letter of resignation to the Executive Committee of the Board during a meeting Thursday evening. He stated that he will become the Southern Sales Manager for Fidelity and Associates of Gastonia, effective July 1.

"Dr. Briggs worked very hard for many years for the improvement of Limestone College," Hill said in a prepared statement. "We wish him well as he enters his new field of work. However, Limestone College will continue its aggressive persuit of a quality educational program.

He had been Dean of Students and Associate Professor of Education at Pfeiffer College from 1966-71.
