The screening sessions are being planned for fifteen students at one time. The first group will begin at 8:30 a.m., the second at 10:30 a.m., and the last at 1:30 p.m. Parents should contact the school in their district to secure application forms and make an appointment for the screening which is on a firstcome, first-serve basis. Parents will need to bring the child's official birth certificate (not the hospital record), his up-to-date immunization record, and a copy of his/her physical examination by the family doctor or the health department.
