Pro Secretaries Week Proclaimed

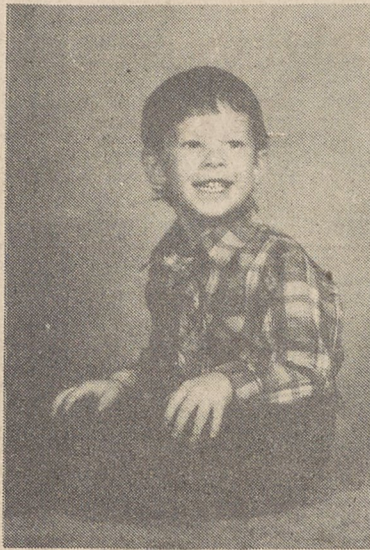

The public is invited to attend the ceremonies planned by Cleveland County's Quadricentennial committee headed by Nance E. Anthony. Project chairman was Grace R. Hamrick. Other committee members are Terre Bullock, Coy P. Elmore, Larry D. Hamrick of Kings Mountain, Charles F. Harry, III, Jack Palmer, Jr., C.J. (Jack) Mabry, Jr., R. Patrick Spangler and Henry Lee Weathers.

Kings Mountain Senior High Band will provide the music and will also accompany Clarence Withrow who will open the program by singing "America" and close with "The Battle Hymn of the Republic."

Speaker will be Lindsay Warren, Jr. of Goldsboro, state chairman. He will be introduced by Jack Palmer, Jr., former County Commission chairman.

The Project started last summer and includes pruning trees on the old courthouse grounds, cutting down old ones and opening the pretty structure which was almost obscured by overgrown and neglected trees. beauty and will multiply as years go by.

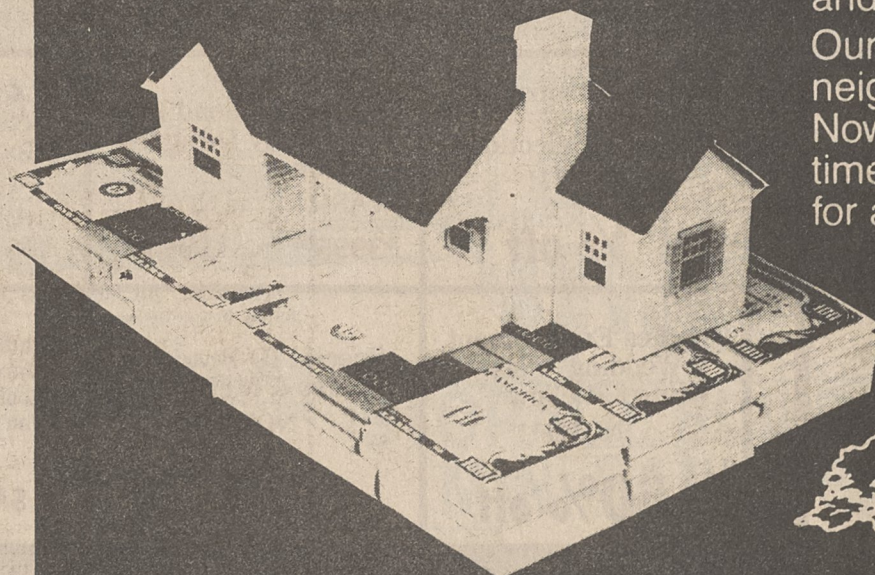
