Tom Tate said, "I have enjoyed working with the students this year. It reminded me of my teaching days. The students were very interested in my work and I enjoyed explaining it to them."

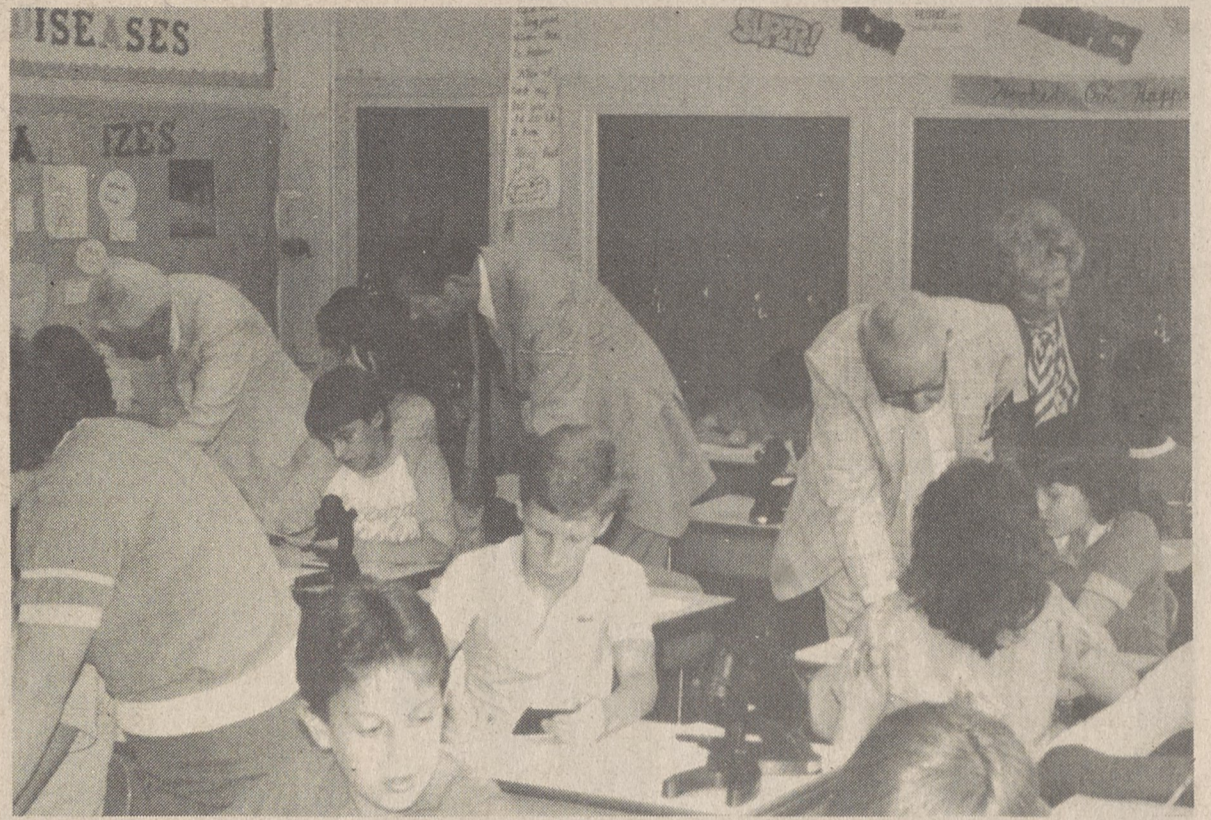
