Rev. Eugene Land, pastor of Second Baptist Church, is attending the Southern Baptist Convention in Dallas, Texas.

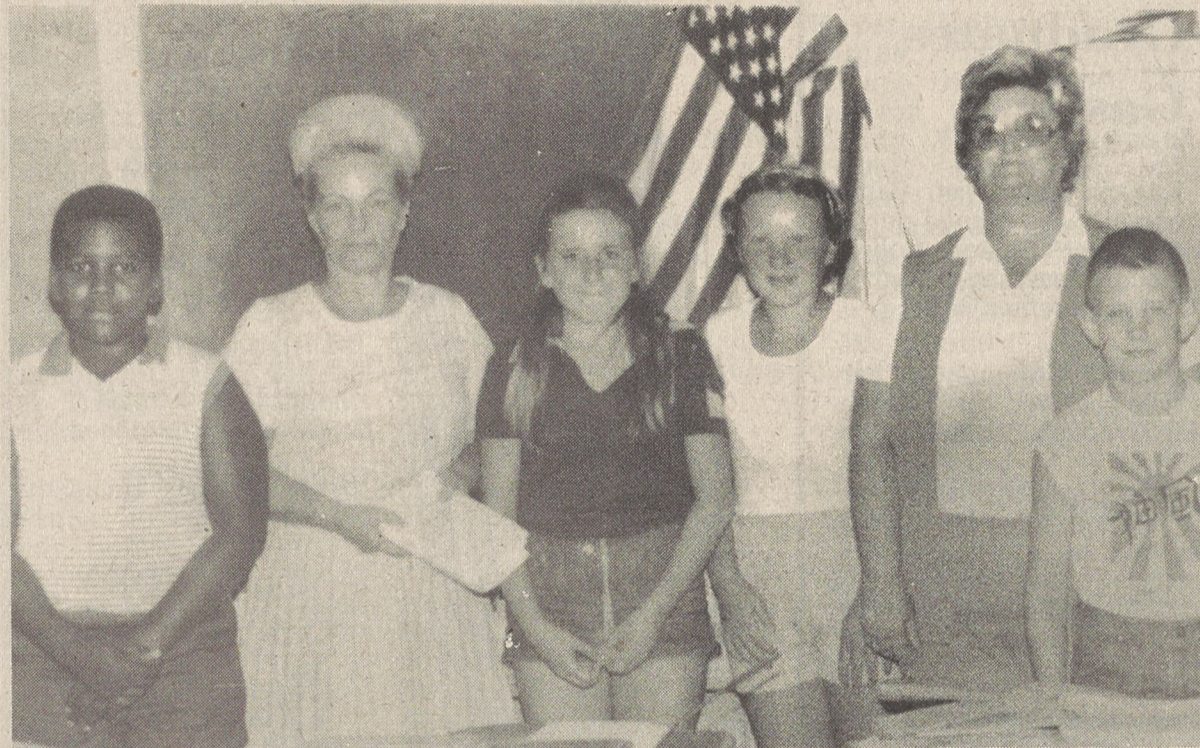
Local people can see the convention sessions on television in the Fellowship

Other new officers are Esther Muench, vice president; William McSwain, secretary; and Vivian Duncan, treasurer.

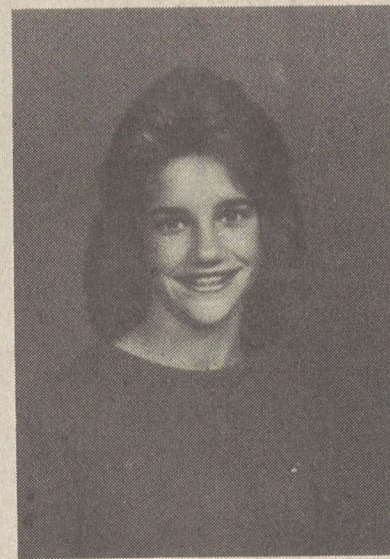
The members of the Board
