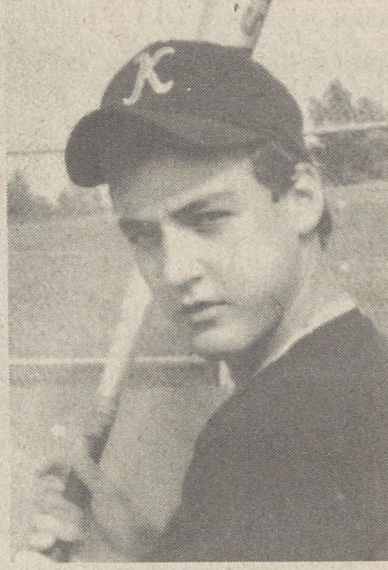
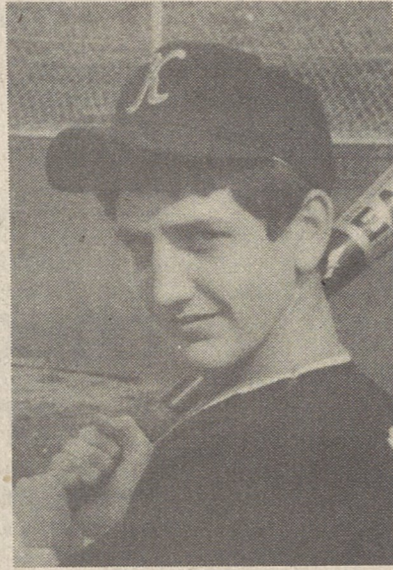

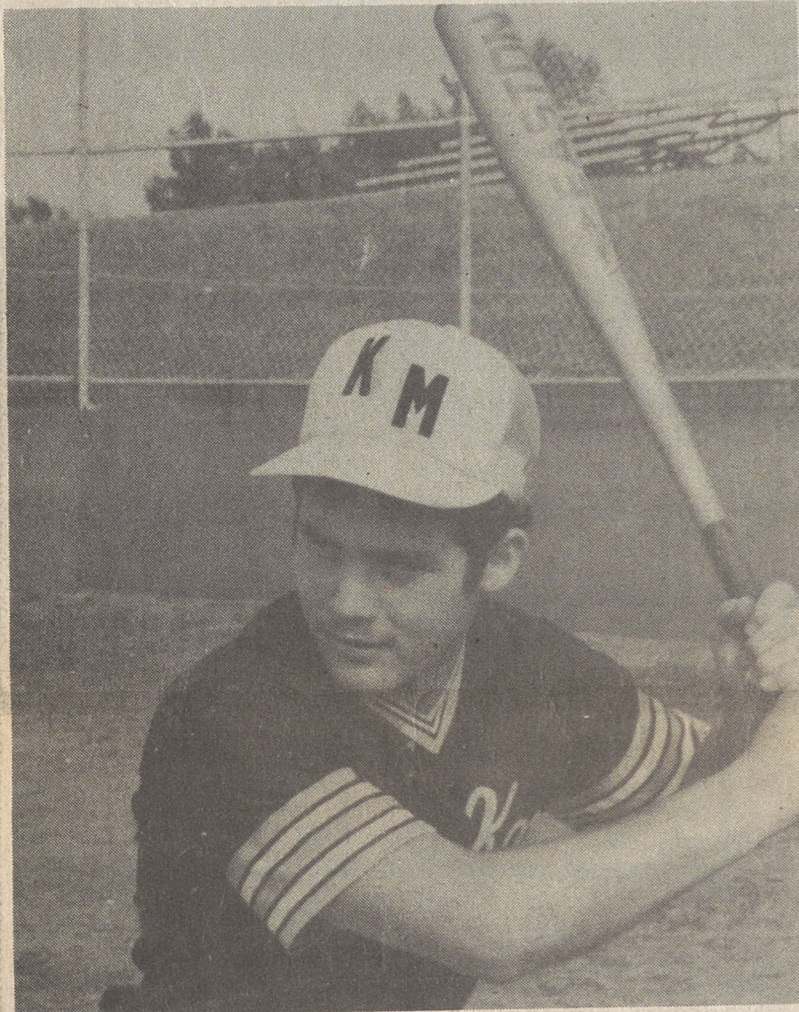
Breakfield had two of KM's five hits and Franklin, Neisler and Todd Fleming had one apiece.
