Dee Patterson was the winning pitcher in both of Cable Link's victories.

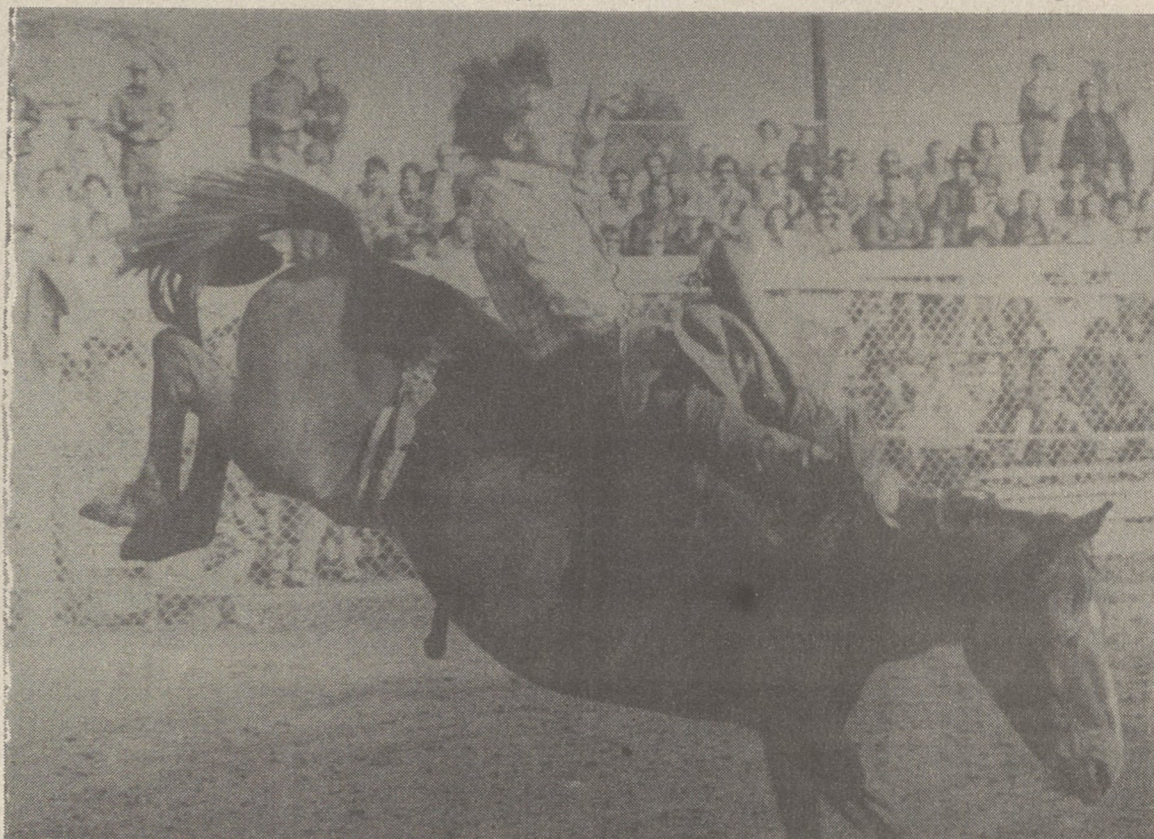
**Booster's Club Meets Monday**
