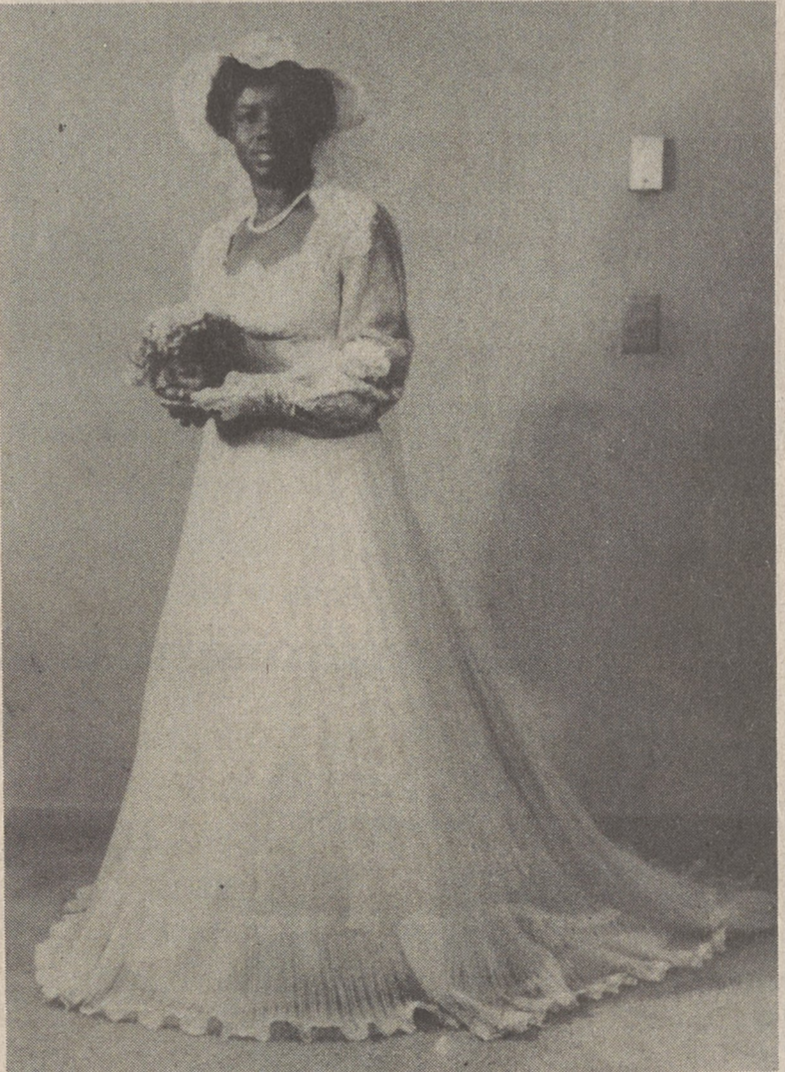
Rev. Johnny Costner, pastor of Landmark Baptist Church, of Bessemer City, heard the exchange of vows in the presence of the immediate families and close friends.
