KM Educators Attend Seminar

Nine educators from Kings Mountain are back from Atlanta, Ga. where they attended a five day Madeline Hunter Seminar by the National Academy for School Executives, the staff development branch of the American Association of School Administrators.

Dr. Hunter, who led the workshops, is a member of the staff of the University of California at Los Angeles and the adjunct lecturer in the School of Education.

Dr. Hunter has developed a clinical theory of instruction based on the premise that the teacher is a decision maker. Workshop sessions each day at the Atlanta Hilton dealt with psychological learning theories, methods of questioning, selection of content, characteristics of executive teaching and background knowledge.

For the past three years the Kings Mountain District Schools have been innovative in their approach to the Hunter program, using her

tools such as films, video tapes, books, etc. in the classroom. On the last day of the seminar, local teachers and others from a wide area taught a lesson in the classroom with their fellow teachers as students and with Dr. Hunter evaluating the lessons. Local teachers spent several hours after class sessions taping teaching techniques to be implemented here and in proceeding with new teacher certification programs.

Making the trip were Bethware Principal Ronnie Nanney, Asst. Supt. Larry Allen, Director of Exceptional Children Jean Thrift, Supervisor Martha Bridges, Grover Principal Jim Scruggs, KM Junior High Principal Jerry Hoyle, KM Senior High Principal Ronnie

Wilson, KM Senior High Assistant Principal Jackie Lavender, and Central Principal Glenda O'Shields.

The conference program was based on the Hunter teaching principles and students were from Saudi Arabia, Alaska, Pennsylvania, Alabama, West Virginia, Louisiana and the two Carolinas.

The Hunter model of teaching increases the probability of learning by identifying professional decisions teachers must make, supplying research-based-cause-effect relationships to support those decisions and encouraging the teacher to use data emerging from student and situation to augment or correct those decisions.

A car wash and bake sale will be held Saturday at Temple Baptist Church.

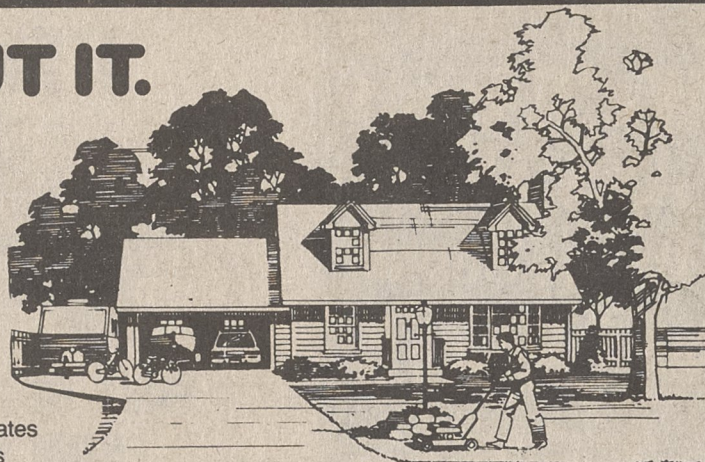
Cars will be cleaned inside and out for a donation of \$5 or
