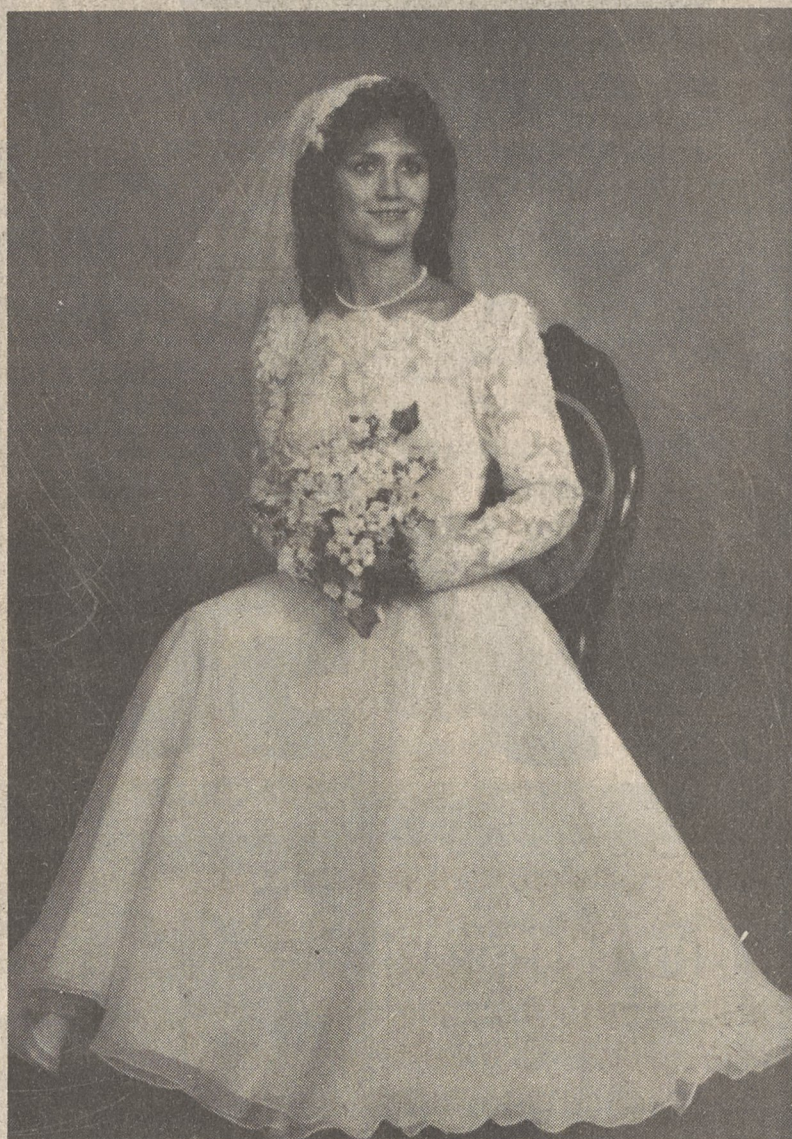
The bride, who was escorted by her brother, wore
