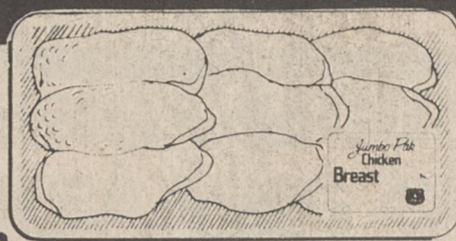

Charleston Tour Set By Gaston

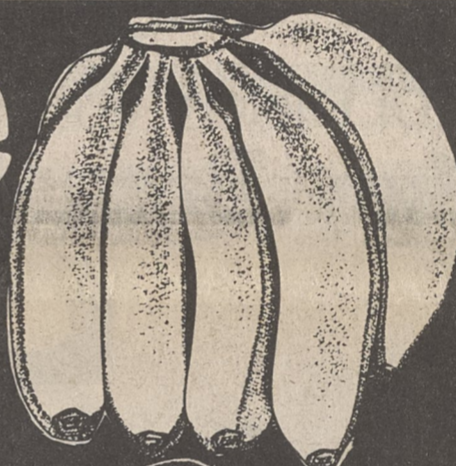
Gaston College is sponsoring a tour to historic Charleston, South Carolina on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, September 13, 14 and 15.
