Broyhill **Testifies** At Hearing

WASHINGTON-"If current import trends continue, by 1995 our nation will no longer have a textile in-dustry,' Congressman James T. Broyhill (R-NC), said Monday in testimony before a United States Senate subcommittee.


Broyhill made his com-ments in support of the Tex-tile and Apparel Trade Enforcement Act of 1985, which he introduced in March. His remarks before the Senate Finance Committee's Subcommittee on International Trade were intended to highlight the need for strong ported textile and apparel products into the United States.

According to Broyhill, the threat to the U.S. textile, fiber and apparel industry has reached a critical stage. and domestic manufacturers have already been forced to lay off hundreds of thousands of employees due to unfair and illegal import practices.


"Last year, in North Carolina alone, 43 plants closed, displacing 18,000 workers,' the 12-term Representative said. In Broyhill's view, the Textile and Apparel Trade Enforcement Act is "important to this nation's economy as well as to more than two million textile and apparel employees across the

Broyhill was joined at the Senate hearing by Senator Jesse Helms (R-NC), Ninth District Congressman Alex McMillan, and by South Carolina Senators Strom Thurmond and Ernest Hollings.

The Textile and Apparel Trade Enforcement Act has been co-sponsored by a majority of the members of both the Senate and the House of Representatives.


