

000 ZUCCHINI-TOMATO SALAD 6 small zucchini, thinly sliced 4 tomatoes cut into wedges 1 green pepper, thinly sliced into rings 1/4 cup chopped green onion 1/4 cup vinegar 1/2 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. garlic salt 1/2 tsp. pepper ³/₄ cup salad oil zucchini, Combine tomatoes, green peppers and green onions. Toss lightly. Combine remaining ingre-

dients and pour over vegetables. Chill several hours, stirring occasionally Serve on lettuce if desired. Yield: 6-8 servings.
