### The Pantry Is Robbed Wednesday

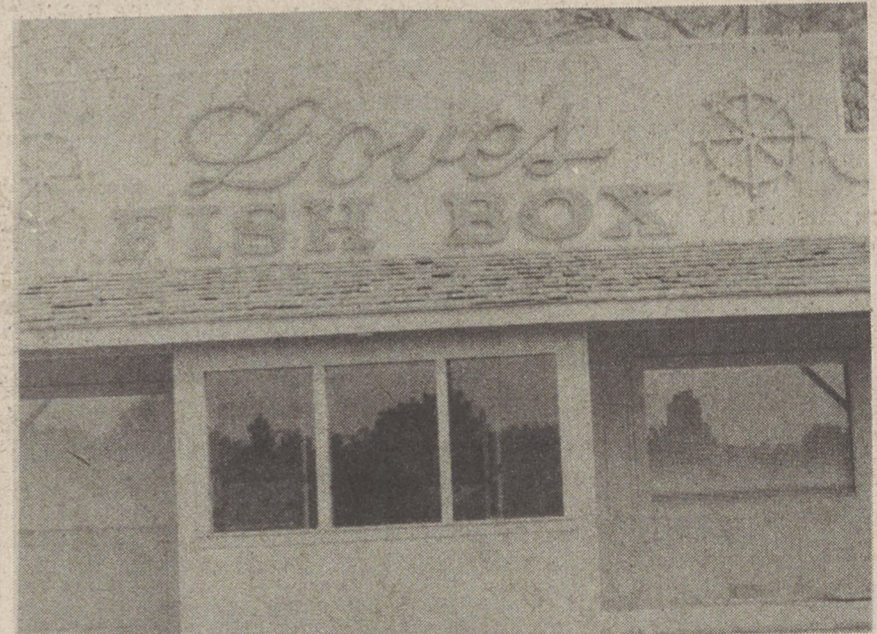
A lone gunman robbed The Pantry at Linwood Road and Cleveland Avenue early last Wednesday morning, police said.
