ticipated at more than 500.

DuPont officials said the Kings Mountain site was chosen because of the existing facility with appropriate space, the availability of good transportation, the central location for reaching the distribution centers of the major recording companies, a good labor pool, and a good relationship between industry and government.

The Kings Mountain facility will be the first new manufacturing facility under the joint venture.

DuPont and Philips expect to become the preeminent supplier of compact discs and high density information discs worldwide. They will be combining all their existing compact disc and high density information storage operations and will supply discs for the worldwide audio, video and data markets. They expect to generate sales of \$1 billion in five years.

Initial assets of the enterprise include an editing plant in Hanover, West Germany; an existing "laser vision" video disc and data disc facility in Blackburn, England; an existing high density optical disc development facility near Wilmington, Del.; a development

facility in Eindhoven, the Netherlands, and access to all research or DuPont and Philips.

The Sulzer-Ruti plant had been on the market since earlier this year. Its peak employment had been about 160.

Mayor Moss said that officials of DuPont-Philips are expected in Kings Mountain in the next few days.

"We are extremely pleased with the announcement by this new industrial citizen for many reasons," said the Mayor. "The job opportunities for citizens of the Greater Kings Mountain area is tremendous. We are quite proud that two giant world companies would select the Kings Mountain area from among many other cities in the world but we are particularly proud and appreciate all the people who influenced their decision to locate in this area. It's a great economic boost for the Kings Mountain area and Cleveland County and I think it quite fitting that the announcement follows on the heels of the launching by the City of Kings Mountain and Chamber of Commerce of "Looking Forward Kings Mountain", a program designed to boost economic growth in the area," said Moss.

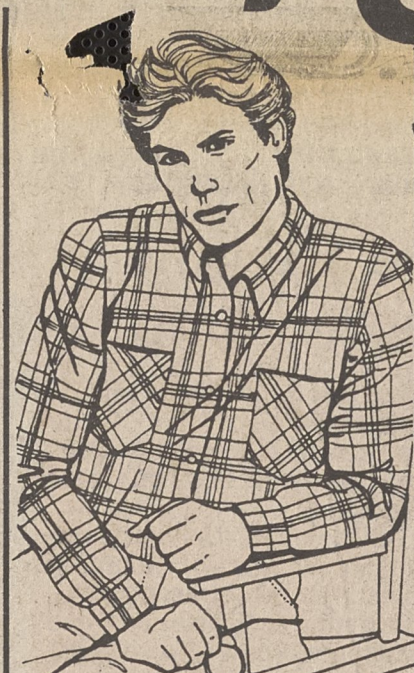
