GI Bill Provides College Funds

While many sources of state and federally-sponsored scholarships have been drying up in recent years, one way to pay for the ever-increasing cost of tuition is the New GI Bill.

The tuition benefit for those who serve in the Army Reserve is as much as \$140 per month if a student is enrolled in school full-time; \$105 per month for those attending three-quarters time; and \$70 per month for half-time enrollment.

The money, as many high school seniors pondering their future already know, can always be put to good use.

There's no course requirement; students choose what they want to study in college, and they can attend the school of their choice, as long as it's accredited.

Few students are aware of the New GI Bill, and many are not sure what the Army Reserve has to offer.

In The Army Reserve, young men and women from throughout the nation train with pay to do a soldier's job on a part-time basis for one weekend a month at a local Army Reserve center, and for two weeks of annual training -- about 38 days a year.

In addition to the military training, Army Reservists receive skills training in one of 350 job specialties, most of which are applicable to the

civilian job market. The instructors, like those on campus, are experts in the skills they teach.

Those who do not plan to go directly on to college can join the Army for a two, three or four-year period and receive GI Bill funds which in many cases can add up to full tuition.

Besides the GI Bill, the Army Reserve offers an enlistment bonus for qualified members, and a Federal Loan Forgiveness Program in which the Army will pay for a large portion of tuition loans made to students who serve in the Army Reserve.

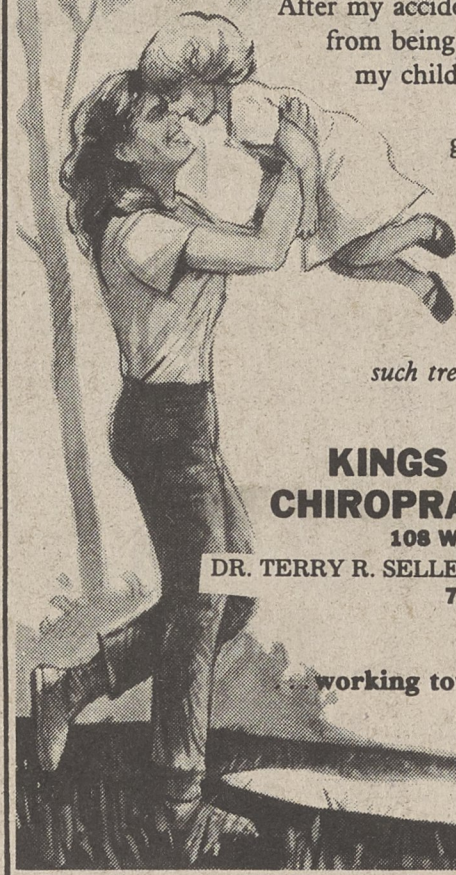
Many young men and women develop discipline, leadership skills and a new level of maturity. All of these are characteristics that civilian employers look for in their employees.

30 Merit Scholarships To UNC-G Available

Approximately 30 scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,450, based on merit, will be available to incoming freshmen during the 1986-87 academic year through the Competitive Awards Program at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Announcement of the competition was mailed to North Carolina high schools Oct. 23.

The scholarships included Katharine Smith Reynolds Awards, Alumni Awards, Kathleen P. and Joseph M. Bryan Awards, a Jefferson-Pilot Award and an NCNB award.

At least 15 of the scholarships will be awarded to North Carolina residents. All competitive scholarship recipients will be selected on the bases of academic achievement and promise, leadership, and evidence of commitment to service for others, according to Marleen B. Ingle, director of student aid at UNC-G.

Application deadline for the awards is Jan. 1, 1986. However, interested high school seniors are urged to apply for admission to UNC-G immediately and to complete application for competitive scholarships by Dec. 1, if possible.

Requests for applications and further information may be obtained by writing the Office of Student Aid, 243 Mossman Building, UNC-G, Greensboro, North Carolina, 27412-5001.

Fifty-two finalists for competitive scholarships will be invited to the UNC-G campus on Feb. 2-3 for a series of in-

terviews and programs. The finalists will be guests of the University overnight, visit classes, meet with students and learn about programs offered at UNC-G. Award winners will be announced in the spring.

Funds for the Katharine Smith Reynolds Awards are made available from the Z. Smith Reynolds Foundation. The UNC-G Alumni Association provides money for the Alumni Awards. The Kathleen P. and Joseph M. Bryan Scholarships were created at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro through \$1 million gift made by Mr. and Mrs. Bryan. The NCNB and Jefferson-Pilot Awards are derived from endowments established by the corporations.
