Pisgah's defense, which is coached by KM native Tony Leigh, did an outstanding job on Kings Mountain's offense, which is topranked in the Southwestern 3-A Conference. For the game, the Mountaineers managed only 91 yards rushing. Leading rusher Jerry Jordan was limited to 36 yards for the game and only three in the second half. The Pisgah defense broke through the line to throw KM backs for losses eight times. Fullbacks Hollifield and Sam Smith were the only KM backs to have plus yardage on every carry. Pisgah also defensed well against the KM

passing attack. The Mounties hit only one of

10 attempts and were forced to go long all night because of excellent short coverage by the Bears.

The victory was the first post-season playoff win for a KMHS football team since 1956, when the Mountaineers edged Lenoir 7-6 for the Western Association championship. The victory also tied a school record for the most wins (10) in a season. That mark is shared by the 1955, 1956 and 1964 teams.

The Mountaineers also set a new season scoring record. The 14 points gave them 290 points for the year and broke the old mark of 284 points set by the 1955 team.
