

Barbara Rhea Honored

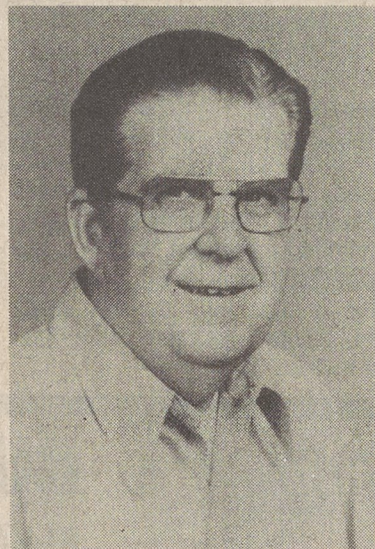

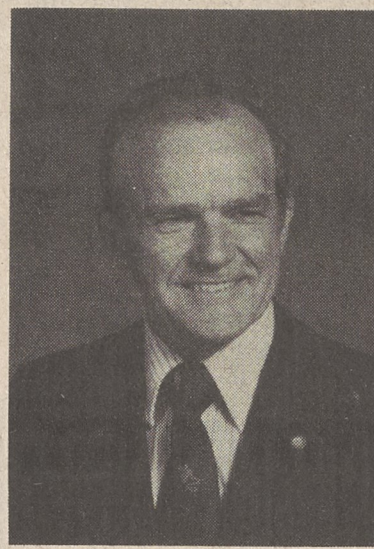
