City Police Report Larceny, Vandalism

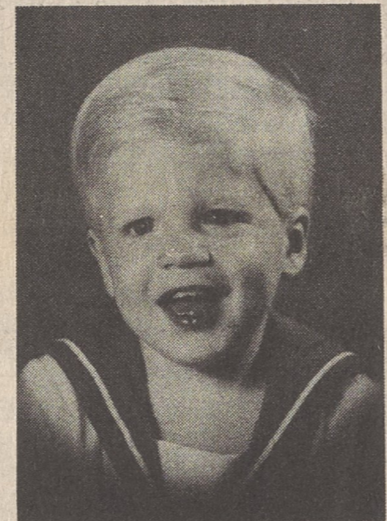
City police are investigating several reports of larceny and vandalism.
