Jeff Lineberger of Route 2, Dallas has been commissioned as a nuclear propulsion officer in the United States Navy. Ensign Lineberger received his commission on September 26, following 16 weeks of training at Naval Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island.

A 1985 graduate of N.C. State University, he is the son of Harold and Patsy Lineberger of the Dallas-Stanley Highway, former Kings Mountain residents.

At OCS, Jeff took courses focused on providing new officers with a basic understanding of the Navy, such as seamanship, piloting, celestial navigation, engineering and Naval leadership. He graduated with distinction, finishing fifth in his class of 355.
