### THE BOTTOM LINE

Selling your home? What is it really worth? Real estate experts no longer consider the simple market price as the bottom line figure. Even if the seller added the cost of his financing to the market price, the true cash equivalency value of the property is lower than he thinks.

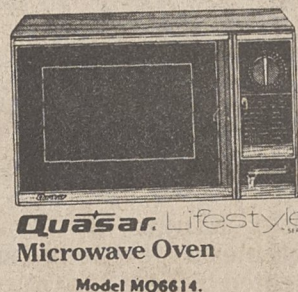
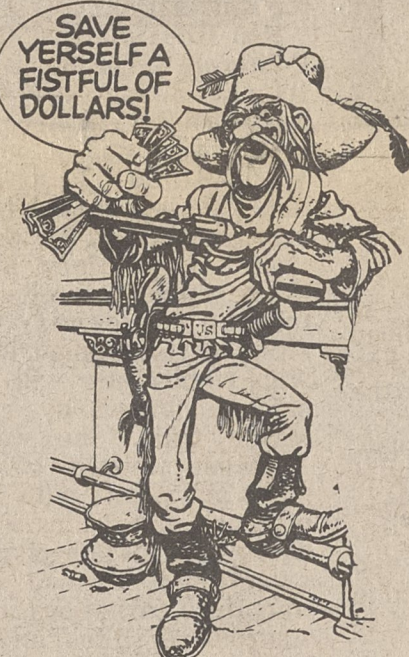
### Copper does affect arthritis

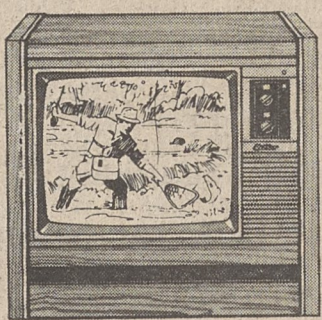

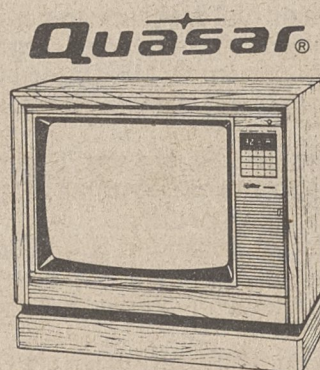

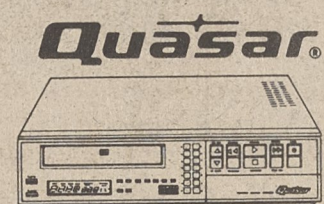
