constantly for more help for her, said Mr. Lawing.

They learned about artificial ears being tested nationwide by Symbion Company a Salt Lake City, Utah company, which also makes the Jarvik 7 artificial heart. Lawing said State Senator J. Ollie Harris of Kings Mountain sent him to U.S. Congressman Jim Broyhill who put him in touch with officials of the Federal Food and Drug Administration and then to Dr. Berryhill at Charlotte Eye, Ear, and Throat Hospital. Cost of the implant, which is covered 80 percent by insurance, is \$20,000, said Lawing.

Mrs. Lawing was in surgery for three and one half hours on Tuesday.

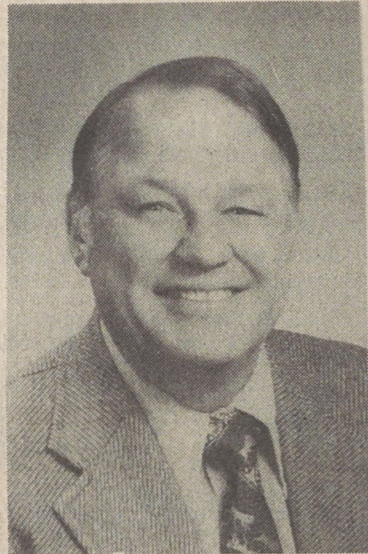
"There will be a lot of adjustment for her when the sounds start coming back", said Lawing, who said that family members had installed a lighted bell above the telephone so that when the telephone rings in their house the bell would light up so that Mrs. Lawing could speak on the telephone. In recent months since her condition worsened, Mrs. Lawing has been unable to hear on the telephone, and although she attends church regularly, could not hear the sermon.

The Lawings are active in Macedonia Baptist Church and members of her congregation were sharing the news of her successful implant with others in the community this week.

"We are just tickled to death", said her husband, we know it's a miracle."

Four Democrats Seek Office

Campaign '86 kicked off Monday at noon with four candidates filing in Cleveland County. Rep. Edith Lutz, Rep. Jack Hunt and Jerry Adams, all Democrats, announced for the N.C. House and Sheriff Buddy McKinney filed for a second term.

Candidates have until Feb. 3 to enter the May 6 primary for local and state office. A runoff would be held June 3. The general election is Nov. 4.

Said McKinney in his filing statement:

"I have chosen this time to announce my candidacy for re-election as the Sheriff of Cleveland County. In 1982, I was both honored and humbled by your tremendous support, and I feel secure again in seeking your vote of confidence.

"During this term, I have maintained regular office hours, both during the week and on weekends. By following this schedule, the office of the Sheriff has been made more accessible to more people than other methods of administration. My doors are always open to the public.

"I have sought to operate my office with fairness and honesty on a daily basis. I have tried, always, to base my decisions on Christian principles of fairness and justice. Recently, I was selected as Law Enforcement Administrator of the Year for Region C which includes Cleveland, Rutherford, Polk, and McDowell counties; I feel that my reputation for fairness and honesty played a major part in my selection.

"I have made available the services of this department to other departments within the Law Enforcement Center and other Cleveland County departments and feel that we now have a better working relation than ever before. I also feel that this cooperation among all departments and the working relation with other law enforcement agencies has helped to achieve better law enforcement for the citizens of Cleveland County without additional expenses.

"I have made several changes within the department, such as combining the Criminal and Civil Divisions,

which resulted in increased road patrol and increased efficiency in serving civil papers. While such crimes as armed robbery has decreased, other crimes, such as breaking and entering, larceny, pornography, and drugs are a continuous battle in Cleveland County and North Carolina.

"The Cleveland County Sheriff's Department appreciates the sincere help and support from the many citizens in our quest to make Cleveland County a safer place to live and work.

"In May of this year, when you go to the polls to vote, I would appreciate your continued support and vote of confidence in the Democratic Primary."

Mrs. Lutz has served this district since 1976.

Rep. Lutz is serving on 10 committees in the North Carolina legislature and is serving as chairman of Local Government II committee and vice chairman of the agriculture committee. She also serves on committees on appropriations, base budget, appropriation expansion budget, appropriation human resources, mental health, insurance, children and youth, law enforcement, state personnel and human resources. She is also serving on three study committees, including mental health, agriculture and municipal incorporation.

"I have enjoyed serving all the people of Cleveland, Rutherford and Polk counties and I have tried to serve all the people of this district to the best of my ability and will continue to do so if I am re-elected," said Mrs. Lutz.

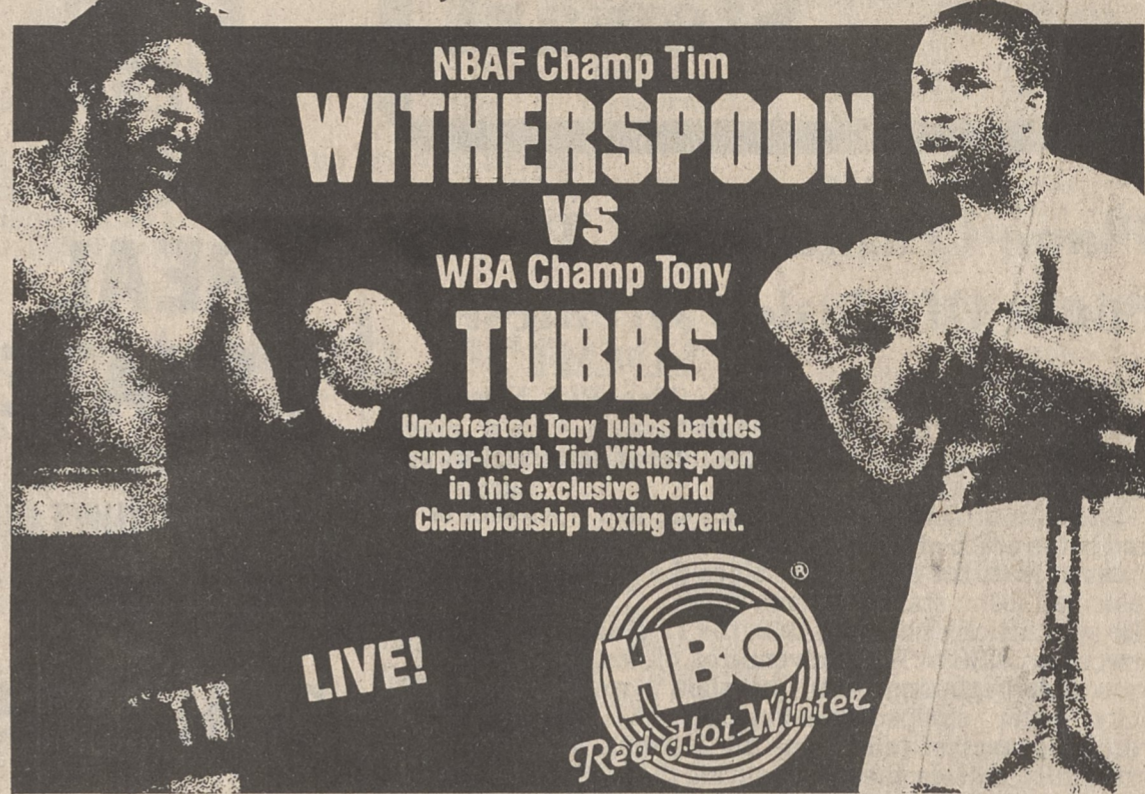

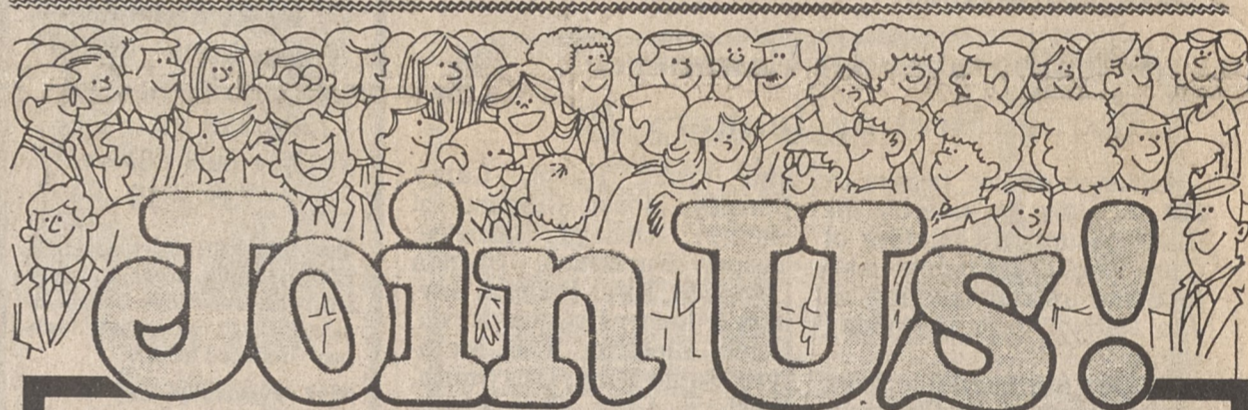

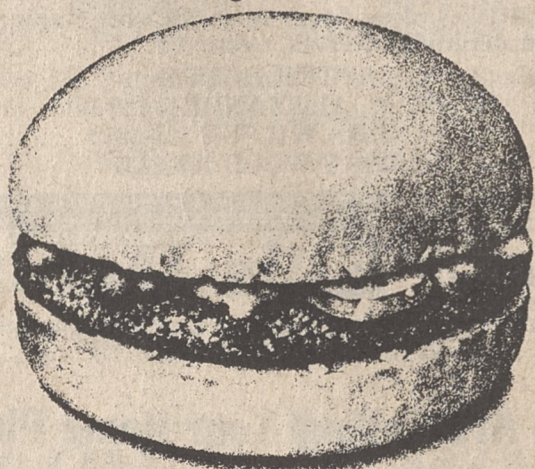
