A Health Fair for senior citizens of the Kings Mountain area on Monday, March 10th, at Central United Methodist Church, will offer a variety of free services to senior citizens.

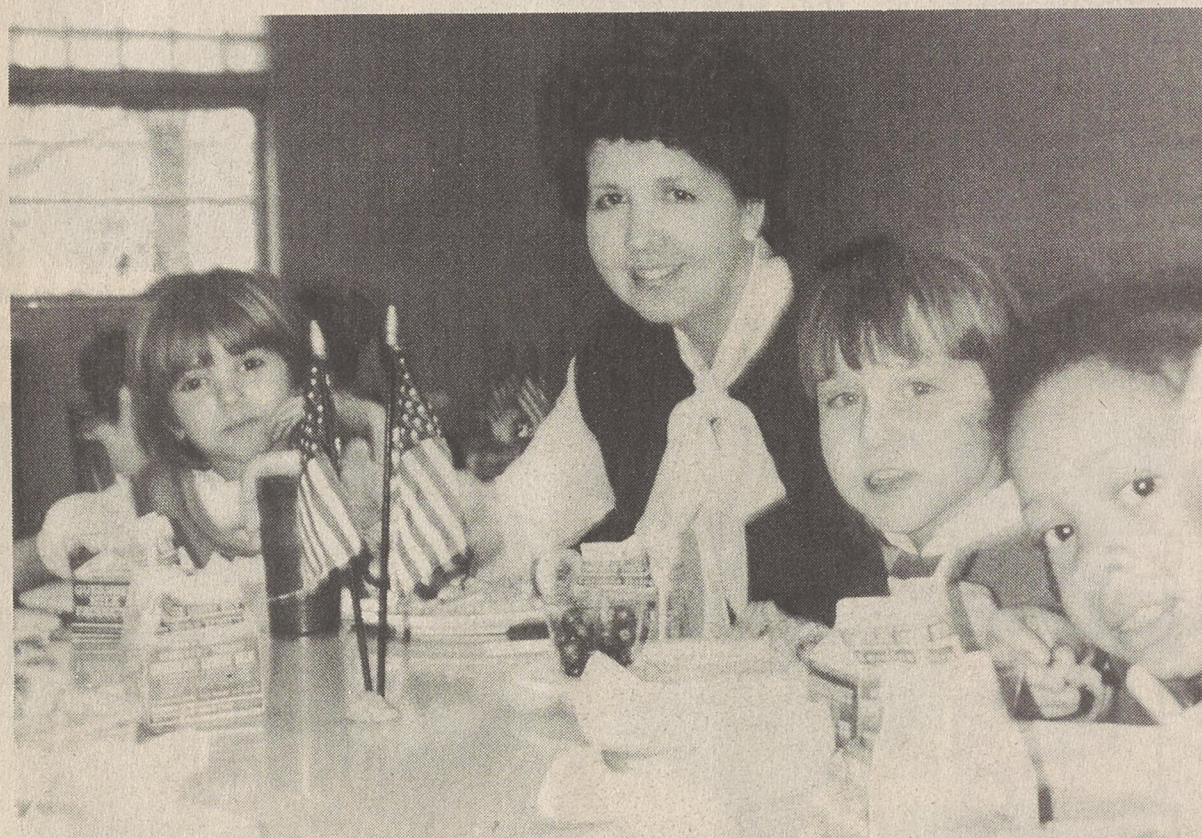
Eleven different screenings will be included in the free service, including glaucoma, diabetes,

organization of ideas, thoroughness, clarity and attractiveness of the presentation.

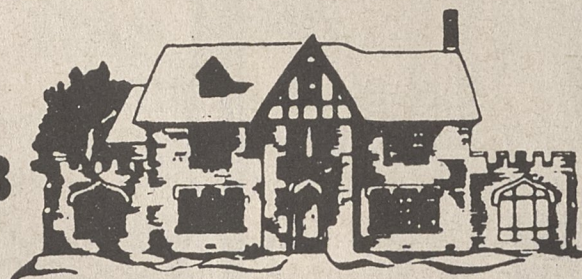
The students used graphics screen location grids that divide the computer screen into the 64 horizontal and 32 vertical locations. These grids were used in planning the graphics illustration. Correct number orders and program sequence are necessary to run the program

with errors. Design balance is necessary to give a good general overall appearance. The coordinator for the points must be accurately located, read, and typed to place the illustrations correctly on the computer screens.

"The project enhanced the students' computer skills while building essential mathematics concepts," Mrs. Stewart said.

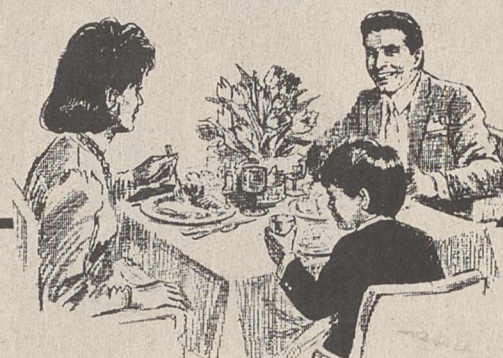
