

Wildlife Public Hearing Set

The North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission will hold a public hearing on proposed changes in hunting, fishing and trapping regulations for the 1986-87

seasons on Thursday, March 20. This hearing will be held at the Morganton Junior High School in Morganton and will be at 7 p.m.

According to Dr. Jack Hamrick of Shelby, Wildlife Commissioner for District 8, "Several proposed regulation changes will have an impact on our district. It is important that sportsmen attend this meeting and comment on these changes. After considering the comments of sportsmen across North Carolina, the Wildlife Commission will adopt final regulations at our April meeting."

Proposed regulation changes impacting District 8 include the following:

A proposal to change the bag limit for quail from 10 to 8 birds per day and eliminate the season limit.

A proposal to conduct small game research on quail and rabbit to develop management techniques to increase their numbers.

A proposal to have a mandatory check system for hunters on three game lands. This would include a program for mandatory check in and out of all deer hunters on the Thurmond Chatham Game Land in Wilkes county.

"We hope that everyone interested in Wildlife Commission programs and activities will attend these meetings," states Hamrick. "This public hearing will give sportsmen the opportunity to comment on these and other proposed regulation changes. Their input is important to the Commission and to the future of this state's wildlife resources."

The Wildlife Commission's District 8 includes the following counties: Yancey, Mitchell, Avery, McDowell, Burke, Caldwell, Catawba, Lincoln, Gaston, Cleveland and Rutherford.

Sports Hall of Fame could pay recognition to those persons who have been outstanding athletes and those who have made outstanding contributions to athletics in the city of Kings Mountain, and serve as a catalyst to encourage excellence in sports and other sports-related careers," Mayor Moss said.

"I envision the committee organizing at an early date and it is my hope that the entire community could become involved in the nomination of potential members."

Mayor Moss said he has asked Charlie Horne of Shelby and Charlie (Choo Choo) Justice of Cherryville, both members of the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame committee, to advise the local committee during its structuring period.

Moss said he hopes that the first Hall of Fame banquet and inductions can be held no later than August.
