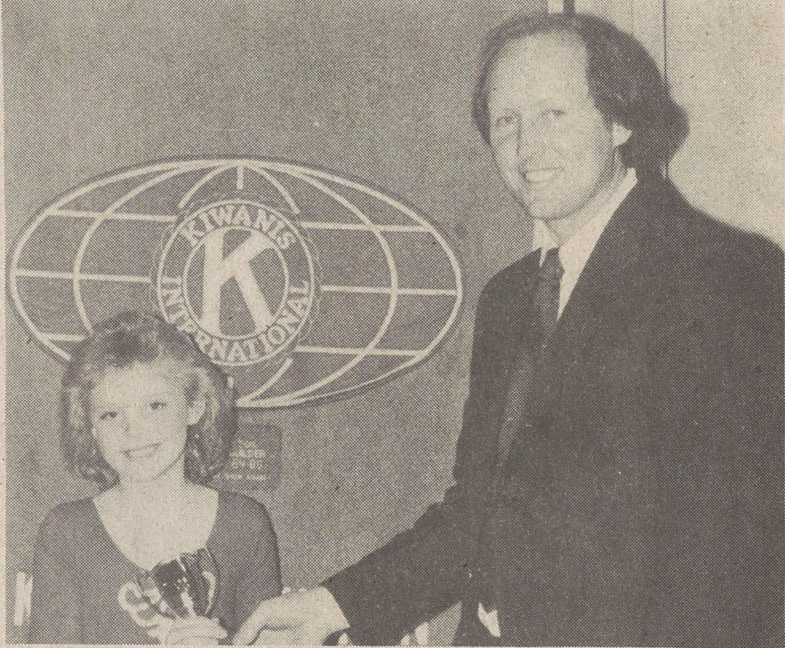
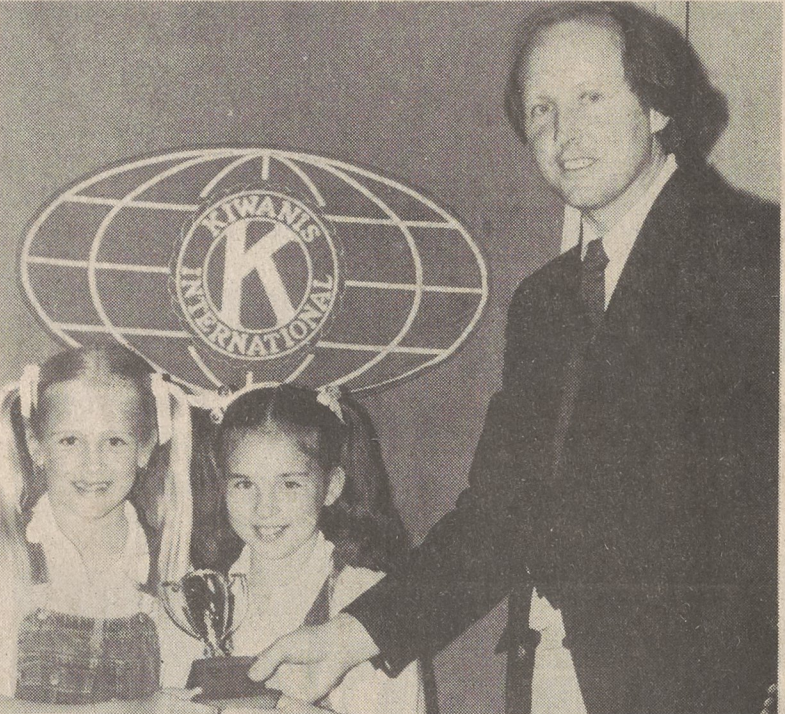


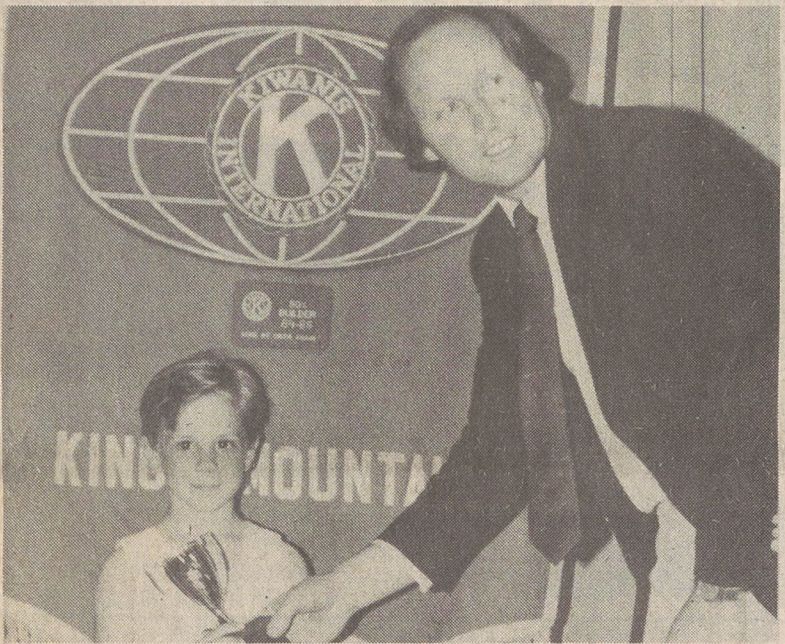
Talent Show Winners Named

Proceeds benefit Kiwanis sponsored community projects.

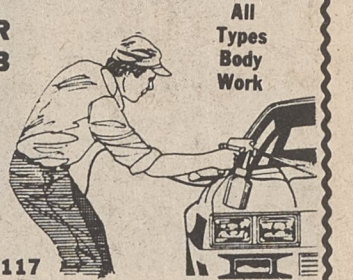
