Items Being Donated To KM Historical Museum

Let's go sightseeing in the past of the Kings Mountain community!

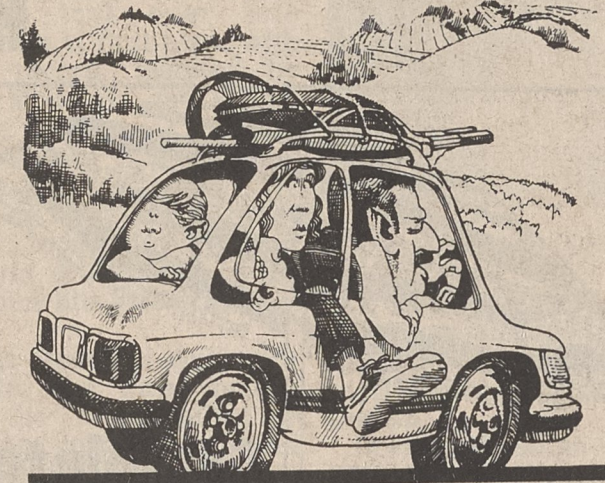
Walk slowly past the two front windows of Dellinger's Jewel Shop facing Mountain Street, then go inside to view some of the articles from the collection already provided by citizens for the Kings Mountain Historical Museum.

Among these items are Captain Meek Ormond's railroad lantern given by Mrs. Sara Kate Ormond heirs; Hunter Mauney's wooden roller skates, a quilt that belonged to Mrs. Candace Miller Mauney, a 1900 copy of the Kings Mountain Herald, a 1922 copy of the Progressive Farmer, and an October, 1909 copy of the Charlotte Daily Observer containing an article describing the dedication of the \$30,000 monument at the Kings Mountain Battleground honoring Kings Mountain heroes, all given by Mrs. Virginia Mauney Herndon; a Mr. Huffstickler's miner's head lantern he used in the Kings Mountain Gold Mine, given by Mrs. Willie Mobley Dilling; Mrs. Rebecca Anthony Ware's 1895 wedding dress, gloves and shoes, given by Mrs. Lena Ware McGill; Mrs. Candace Miller Mauney's spinning wheel and a milk pitcher cut from a single piece of wood, given by Mrs. Patricia Johnson Herndon; a bracelet and Mrs. Marcus Carpenter's stereoscope, pictures and containers, given by Mrs. Hazel Herndon Fryer; Clarence Carpenter's Practical English Grammar with Exercises in Composition copyrighted in 1900 and Nick Moss's Miln's Progressive Arithmetics copyrighted 1906, given by Miss Fanny Carpenter; a baby dress from the keepsakes of Mrs. Kathryn Moss Neisler, given by the family; a quilt and Frederick Sommer's cane bottom slave chair donated by Mrs. Mary Sommers Neisler; the first lock used on the Gold and Bridge's store, given by J.C. and G.E. Bridges; a water jug of Mrs. Rebecca Brown's, given by Mrs. Virginia McDaniel Arnette; a picture of the old Mountain View Hotel, also showing the old railroad station and the town well, given by Miss Nancy Nickels; a 1922 picture of the Margrace Baseball Team, showing Archie Saunders and High Ormond, who later became a professional player, given by Mrs. Dottie Saunders Southwell, and two pictures of groups gathered October 7, 1923 for the patriotic celebra-

tion, given by the J.E. Anthony family.

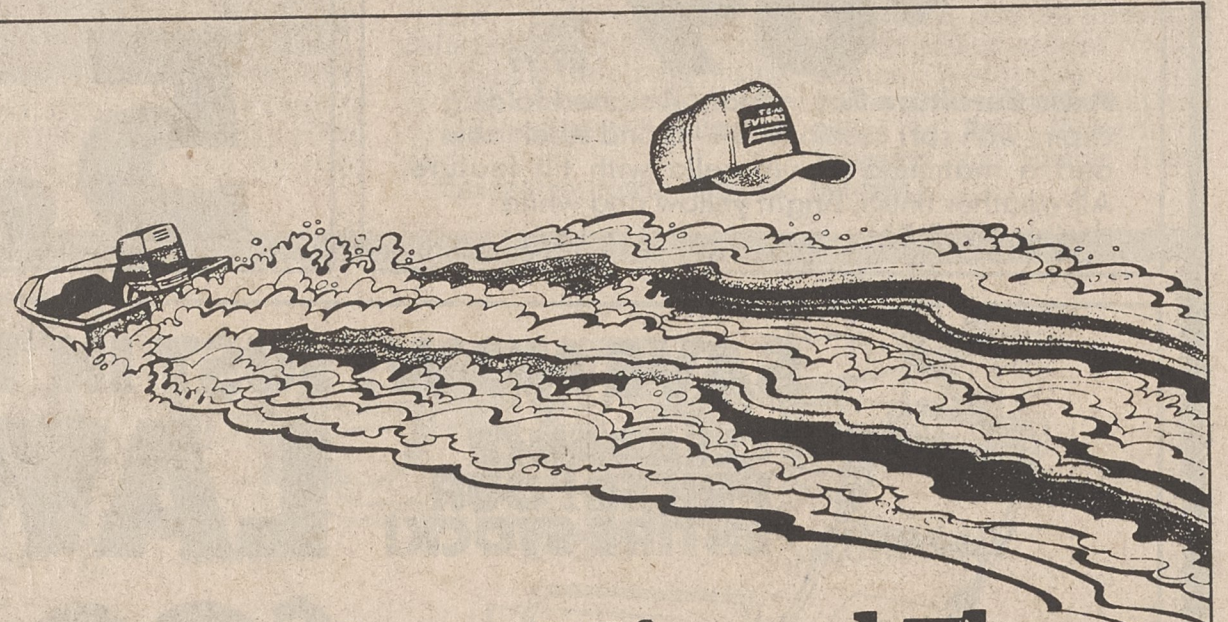

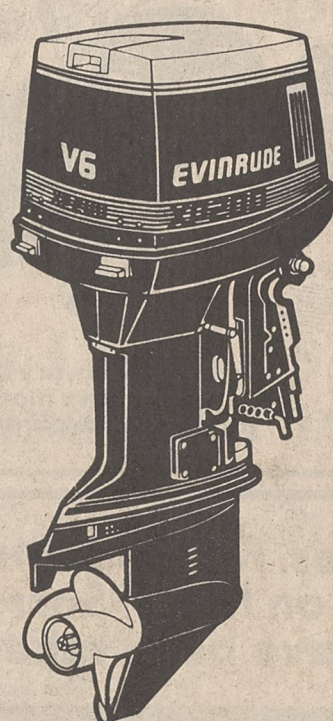
