

# Board Authorizes Cleanup

Davies told the board the city has a total of \$365.35 in unpaid weed cutting bills which date back to 1982 and he recommended, and the board approved unanimously, amendments to the codes ordinances to give him the authority to enforce the ordinances.

The board adopted consideration of declaration that abandoned vehicles on a lot on S. Cansler Street owned by Carroll Clearing Co. and a lot at 614 W. Mountain Street owned by Avery Murray are a health and safety hazard.

In other actions, the board approved final plans from Ruby M. Alexander for redevelopment of Parcel 6 on

the west side of Mountain Street facing Pedestrian Walkway for a four office complex and voted to offer property adjacent to First Union National Bank for sale rather than granting a perpetual easement across city property.

As a safety measure and to improve the flow of traffic at the Little League parks and Commissioners Park this summer, the board approved recommendation of Chief J.D. Barrett to prohibit parking during the summer months at the 200 block of North Deal Street, east side; 400 block of East Ridge Street, north side; both sides of access road from Deal Street to Community Center at fence.

The board gave approval for a training room for the Kings Mountain Fire Department upon recommendation of Chief Gene Tignor, set public hearing for June 10th at 7:30 p.m. for several annexation petition hearings and authorized advertising for bids for Reliance Water Line.

The board referred to the Planning and Zoning Board request from Roger and Faye Brown to rezone property located at 104 N. Carpenter St. to Neighborhood Business

for construction of a cafe and requests from Codes Department that property located at intersection of West Mountain Street and Railroad Avenue (the old Dixon Chevrolet Garage) be rezoned from general to central business and that the property on Cherokee Street (formerly Winn Dixie) be rezoned from general to central business.

The board authorized right-of-way agreement with N.C. Department of Transportation for maintenance of Boy Scout Camp Road and granted an easement as recommended by the city attorney and the Lake Authority for Cross Creek Sub-Division.

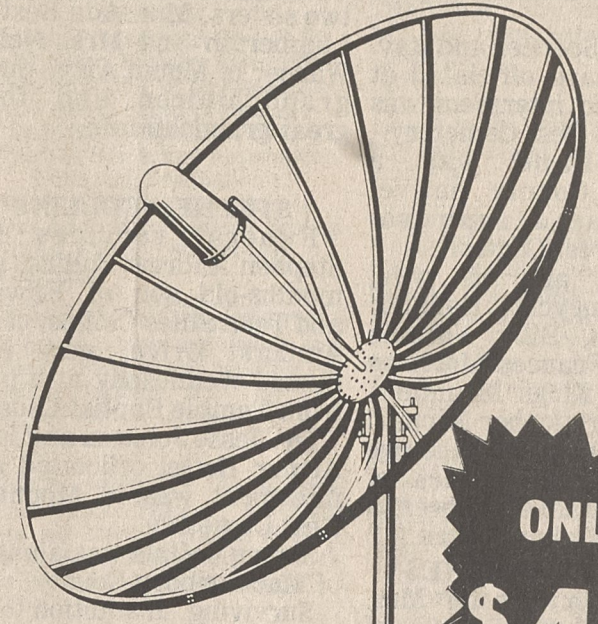
