Bethware Students Present 'How West Was Really Won'

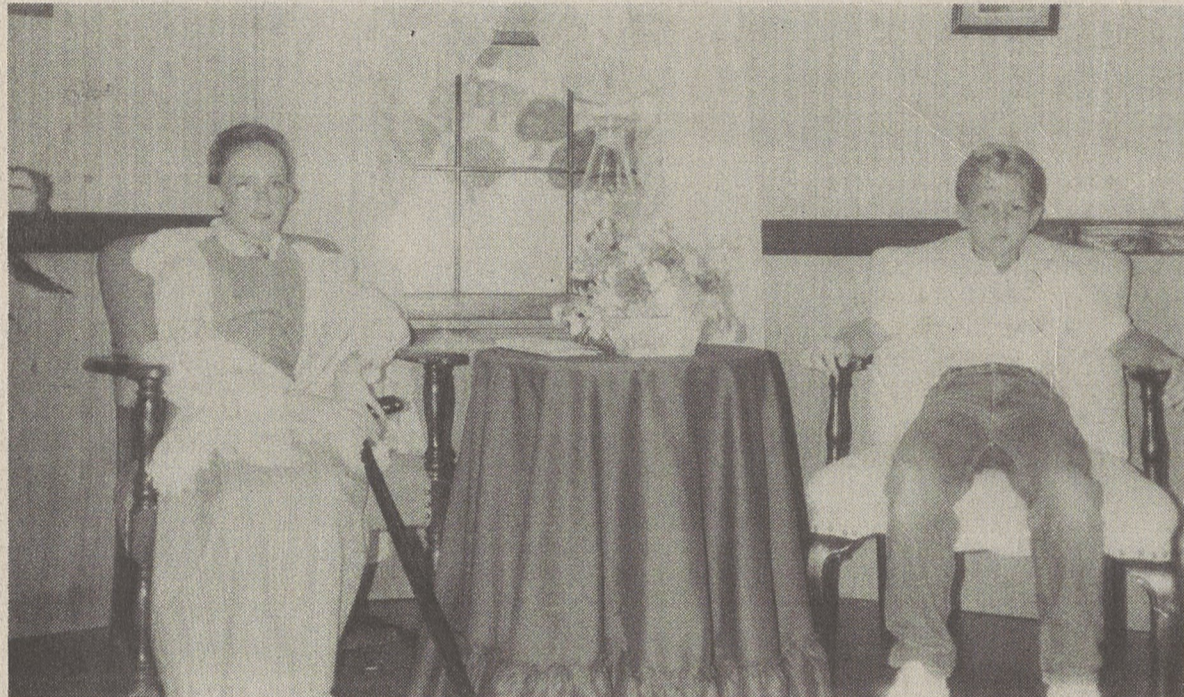
Students at Bethware School presented the musical "How The West Was Really Won" at Monday night's PTO meeting in the school auditorium.

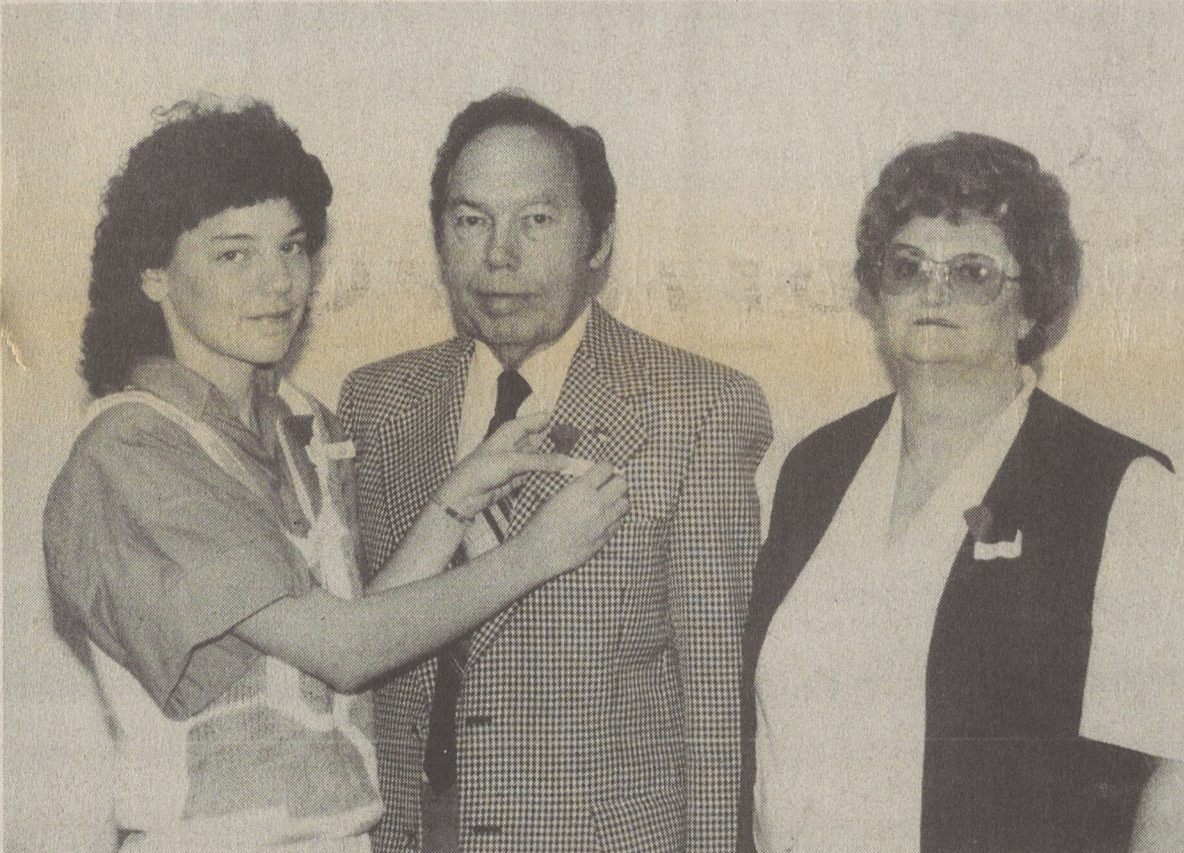

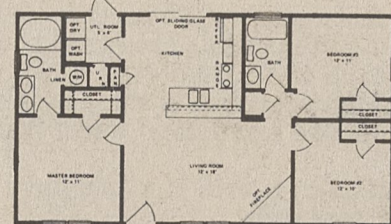
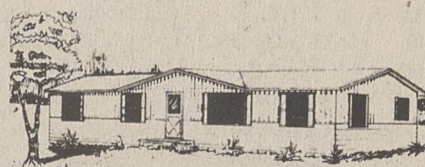
