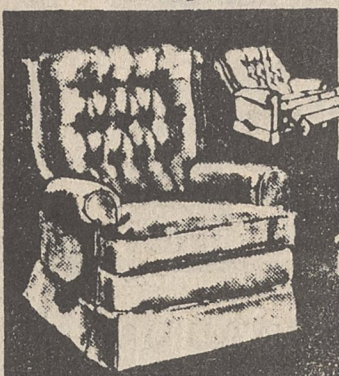

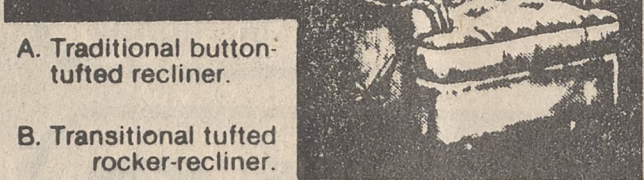

B. Transitional tufted rocker-recliner.

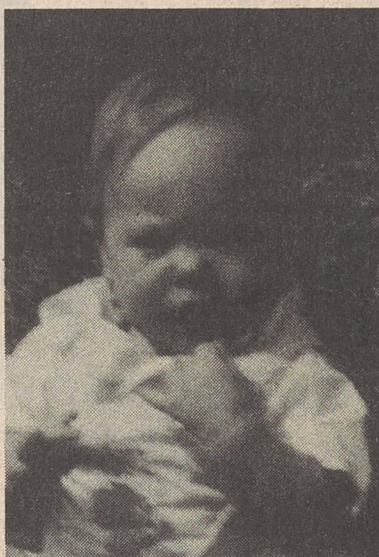
