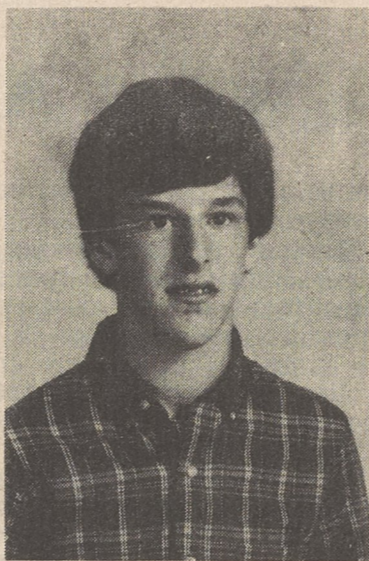
A Small Gold Cup for earning 15 points in the Junior Music Festival went to Brad Grigg, Amy Dixon and Holly Smith.

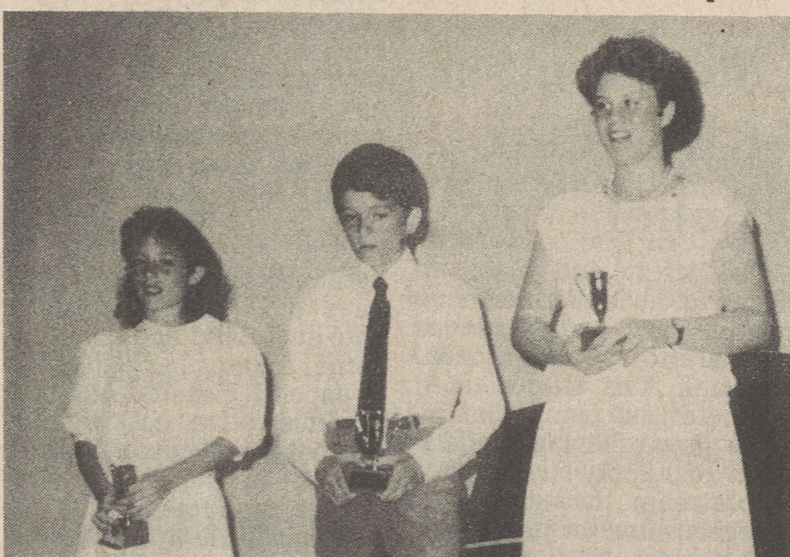

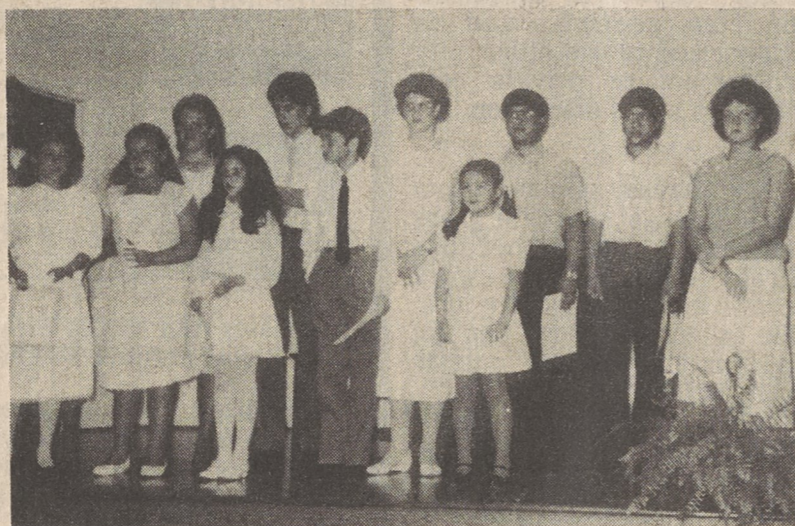
