

Revonda Earns Scholarship

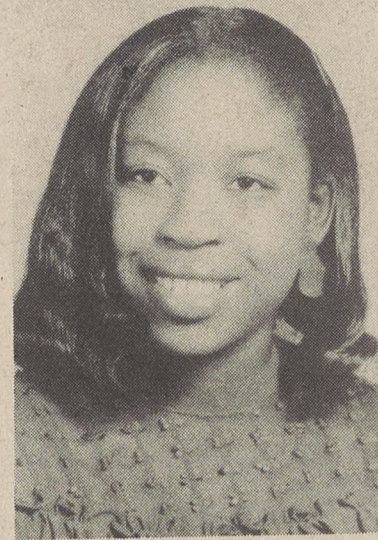

A Kings Mountain student was one of 310 seniors to graduate from Davidson College in commencement exercises May 25.

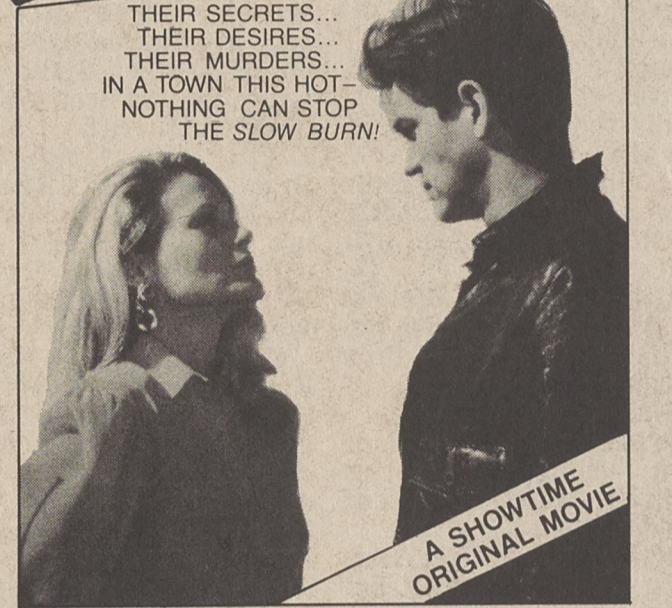

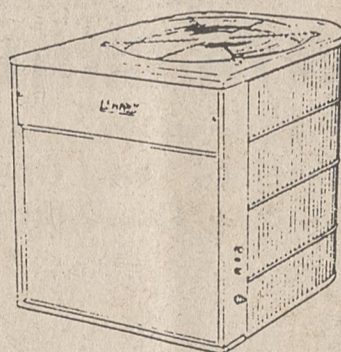
