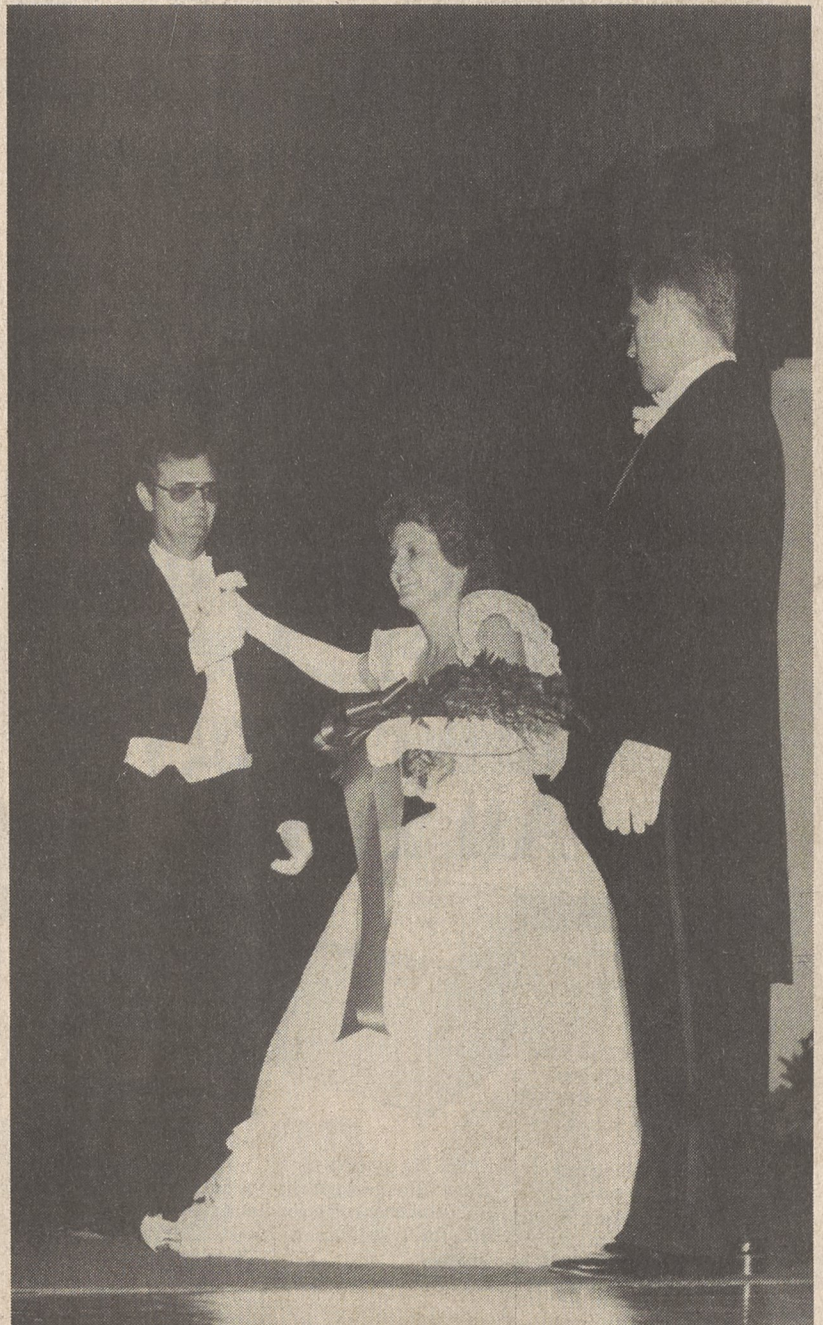
The bridegroom is the son of Mrs. Vernon P. Crosby of
