The drought has also taken its toll on area farmers. Many without irrigation systems have seen their crops almost totally destroyed. An area sale barn reported this week that cattle which usually bring over 60 cents per pound are averaging 30 cents. Many cattlemen are selling part or all of their herds because their pastures have dried up and there is little or no prospects of having a

hay crop.
The National Weather Service reported this week that the chances of the drought ending this year are about 10 percent. Rainfall to date is about 16 inches below nor-
