Ronald Gary Dover, 23, Killed In Wreck Saturday

A 23-year-old Kings Mountain man, Ronald Gary Dover, of 201 Gaston St., was killed in a one car wreck early Saturday morning on Waco Road.

Funeral services were conducted Monday afternoon at 2 p.m. from Harris Funeral Home Chapel by Rev. Larry Turner and Rev. George Moore, interment following in Bethany ARP Church Cemetery.

Dover was traveling east on Road 2026 when his 1969 Chevrolet ran off the roadway on a sharp curve, according to Highway Patrolman J.R. Reid. The vehicle ran down an embankment and turned over on its left side, according to the patrolman's report. Reid said Dover was not wearing a seat

belt and the upper part of his body was thrown out the window. He said Dover had a broken neck and head injuries.

Excessive speed was not a factor in the accident, according to Reid, who said a tire may have blown out.

A native of Cleveland County, Dover was the son of Mrs. Louise Lovelace Dover of Kings Mountain and Paul Dover of Clover, S.C. and was employed by Glen Raven Mills.
