sions between February and March in which Sale allegedly pumped about \$10 worth of gasoline into his personal car without paying for it, and James Pearson, distributor for Fletcher Oil Co. who testified about operation of the self service pumps.

A seven year veteran of the Kings Mountain police force, Sale denied the charges, contending that a fued had developed between him and Oliver, Sr. because Sale had served a warrant on Oliver, Jr. for larceny of gas from his father's station. Sale had subpoened 25 character witnesses and among the dozen called to the stand were City Commissioners Harold Phillips, Fred Finger, Corbet Nicholson and Pete Johnson, owner of East King Gulf Sta-

Judge Phillips ruled in the case after almost a full day of testimony from many witnesses and in a crowded courtroom in Shelby.

According to District Court records, judgement in the case included that Sale "be of good behaviour and not harass or abuse Jerry Oliver, Sr. or any member of his immediate family."


