A combination of The Bessemer City Record and Stanley News, owned by Herald Publishing Company of Kings Mountain, the weekly newspaper will be expand-ed to include the neighboring town of Dallas.

Lois Smith, veteran editor of the Bessemer City Record, will continue as editor.

"Residents of Dallas have expressed their desire to have a weekly newspaper devoted to news and events of Dallas and working together in a tri-city combination we can make the Tri City Record a newspaper the three cities can be proud of", said General Manager Darrell Austin.

Austin said that Dallas readers will be able to turn in their news and pictures to Dub Rankin at Dallas Loan Office, 132 North Gaston Street.


