"This is a significant step for Kings Mountain and the commissioners and I are quite proud to be able to make application for a license for a hydro plant", said the Mayor.

Clifton Corporation, power generating specialists from Spartanburg, S.C., have been working with the city in firming up the final application. Engineer on the hydro project is Charles B. Mierek.

Mayor Moss is acting chairman of the hydro committee, replacing Commissioner Jim Dickey, who served as chairman during his tenure with the city and was recently succeeded on the board by Harold Phillips. Other member of the project committee are Commissioners Norman King and Irvin Allen, Jr.
