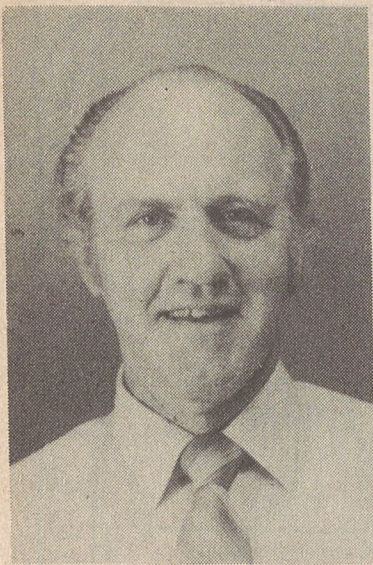


11-Year-Old Injured When Struck By Car
