RALEIGH -- You now have be assessed court costs and ther, ALE agents remind persons that any ID must also bear a physical description of the person named on the card, and dates of validity or expiration must be current.

The use of a fraudulent driver's license or ID, or one issues to another person, in obtaining or attempting to obtain alcoholic beverages is still a misdemeanor. A conviction of this provision may result in a criminal record, the assessment of a fine and/or court costs and the loss of driver's license for one year. Additionally, 19- to 20-year-old persons are subject to misdemeanor criminal charges and oneyear driver's license revocation for allowing another person to use their license or identification documents and for assisting another underage person to buy or consume alcoholic beverages.

The change in the drinking age was prompted by passage of the Surface Transportation Act of 1982 by the U.S. Congress. Any state not adopting the minimum drinking age of 21 by federal fiscal year 1987 will lose 5 percent to 10 percent of its
