Bob Hayes of Kings Mountain predicted 17 of 20 winners to take the \$100 prize in last week's Herald football contest.

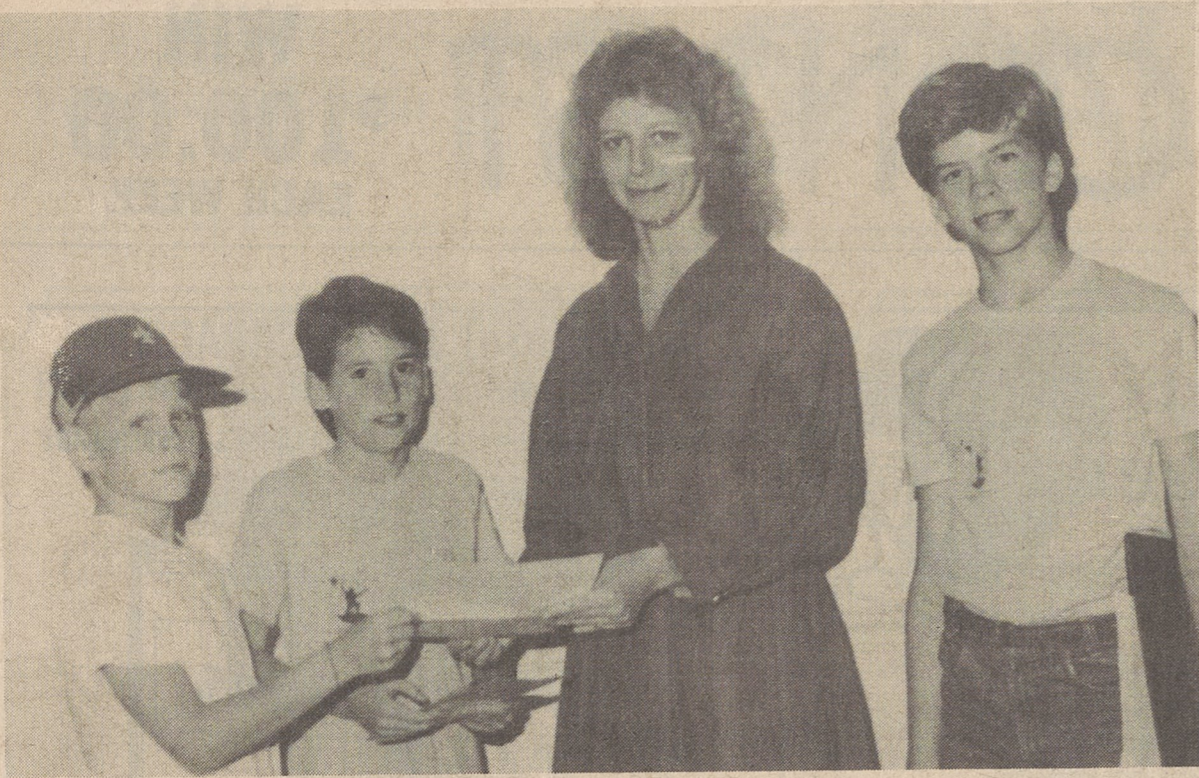
Hayes picked seven of 10 winners of area high school games and hit all 10 winners in area college games.
